Library holdings include almost 2.5 million bound volumes as well as numerous microforms, audiovisual, and electronic resources.

As of May 31, 2009, the University endowment market value was approximately \$880 million.

Baylor is one of the select 10% of U.S. colleges and universities with a Phi Beta Kappa chapter.

85% of entering freshmen return to Baylor for their second year.


