<u>ROCK</u>

The ROCK is Baylor's 52 ft free-standing rock climbing structure located in the McLane Student Life Center. The ROCK offers at least twenty-five top-rope climbs ranging in difficulty from 5.6 to 5.13 for the beginner, intermediate and advanced climber. The ROCK also has several sport lead routes, natural climbing routes, multi-pitch capabilities and a bouldering area. *Job Summary* : All student workers are responsible for all customer service related issues including proper gear usage, climbing instruction and clinics, belaying, safety, and maintaining a positive attitude. Furthermore, student workers are responsible for the cleaning, care and upkeep of equipment at the rock and surrounding area.

MARINA

The Baylor Marina is located on the banks of the Brazos River across University Parks Drive from the main campus. Our fleet contains Sunfish Sailboats, Kayaks and Canoes that can be used for general recreation and instruction. There is a beach front volleyball court; sun deck for recreating and group gatherings; a small fire ring; as well as a bicycle maintenance shop. *Job Summary:* All student workers are responsible for all customer service related issues including proper gear usage, boating instruction and clinics, safety, and maintaining a positive attitude. Furthermore, student workers are responsible for the cleaning, care and upkeep of the Marina facility, waterfront, and program equipment.

OUTDOOR EQUIPMENT RENTAL

The Outdoor Equipment Rental program operates out of the SLC. We offer a wide variety of outdoor equipment including tents, sleeping bags, backpacks and other camping related items for rent to students and staff of Baylor. The equipment room also assists in the planning and equipping of Outdoor Adventure trips and clinics for Campus Recreation, HHPR, and the Outdoor Adventure Living and Learning Center.

Job Summary: Responsible for customer service to patrons checking out the Outdoor Adventure rental equipment and helping outfit students for OA trips. Must have fantastic customer service, knowledge of proper gear usage, safety minded, and have a positive attitude. OA student workers are responsible for maintaining a clean work environment, repairing equipment, notifying supervisor of unsafe situations, communicating gear and parts that need to be ordered/serviced.

STUDENT TRIP AND CLINIC LEADER

The Student Trip and Clinic Leader program offers students the opportunity to put their outdoor leadership skills to work. OA Student Leaders are individuals who have developed skills necessary to lead a group in the great out-of-doors. Leaders are responsible for taking participants into the field, teaching them skills needed to recreate outdoors, and for the safety of the group. This includes development of risk management skills and decision-making abilities. Outdoor leadership qualities expand into urban settings as well—a good trip leader possesses excellent communication skills, decision-making ability, effectively assess and manage risk, and good judgment.

Job Summary: Responsible in the assisting in the planning and implementation of trips and clinics, both land and water based. OA Student Leaders could be involved in any number of the OA program areas such as the Rock, Marina, Rental Program, Baylor OA Line Camps and Eastland Lakes Challenge Course. They also take part in ongoing training and

EASTLAND LAKES CHALLENGE COURSE

The Eastland Lakes Challenge Course is utilized by school groups, businesses, boy/girl scout troops, church groups, athletic teams, non-profit organizations and of course Baylor students and staff. The challenge course is designed to assist groups in developing teamwork and camaraderie as well as be a tool for individual growth, self-confidence and self-discovery. The challenges are both mental and physical in nature. We utilize debriefing and group reflection as a central element in any challenge course experience to facilitate learning and application of the experience to other aspects of life. *Job Summary:* Responsible for facilitating groups of participants to meet group and individual goals. Facilitator may work on low and/or high element challenges based on their abilities, training, and certifications. Training is offered as an HHPR credit as well as through the OA Program. Facilitators must have exceptional communication skills, be safety conscious, display positive attitude, and possess creativity when working with groups.
