

FACULTY

The Pipe Organ Encounter is under the direction of Dr. Joyce Jones, internationally acclaimed concert organist, recording artist, and composer, who is the Joyce Oliver Bowden Professor of Organ and Organist-in-Residence at Baylor University. Among the highly qualified teachers and performers will be Dr. Michael Bedford and Stephen Morris.

INSTRUMENTS

Lessons, recitals, and group sessions will be held at Baylor University, which has some of the finest pipe organs in central Texas. The eleven organs at Baylor University include a 92-rank, 4-manual Petty-Madden, two Ruffatti organs, and two Létourneau organs: a 39-rank, 3-manual tracker in Markham Studio and the 59-rank, 3-manual instrument in Powell Chapel at Truett Seminary, as well as the new 4-manual Walker in Waco Hall.

ACCOMMODATIONS

Housing Sunday through Friday noon will be at Baylor University in double rooms with shared baths. All rooms are air-conditioned. The dormitory counselors are carefully selected, responsible Baylor music majors.

All meals from Sunday night through Friday noon are included in the participant fee.

Check-in is 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. on Sunday, June 8.

The Pipe Organ Encounter ends with a recital by participants at 11:00 a.m. on Friday, June 10.

RESERVATIONS AND FEES

Participant fee is \$450, which covers lessons, group sessions, meals, and housing.

Applications will be processed in the order they are received until all spaces are filled. Enrollment is limited to 20. Priority will be given to those applicants responding by April 15, 2011.

A limited number of spaces at a participant fee of \$295 are available for commuter students. This fee includes lunch each day.

Deadline for applications is May 1, 2011. Applicants will be notified of acceptance by May 8, 2011.
