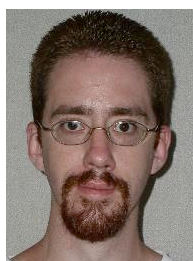

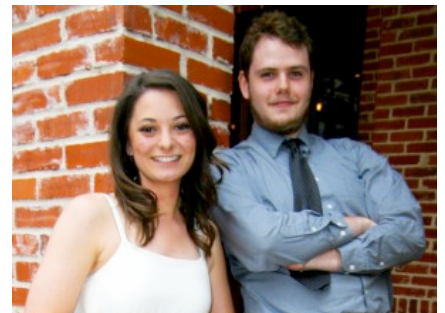


Waco has Wetlands?
