

TRANSITION BY TO Graduate School

\$ Paying the Bills \$

- Income (Thank you Baylor! ©)
 - o Graduate Apprentice Stipend (20 hours/week): estimate \$750/month for 12 months= \$9,000 year
 - Tuition Stipend *Does not cover "fees" or parking decal ☺
- Where All Your Money Will Disappear To
 - Baylor Fees (1,379/semester)
 - o Books (\$400+?) (Think about buying used &/or ONLINE, or borrow from 2nd year cohort members)
 - Housing & Utilities
 - o Transportation (payments, gas, tags, decals, etc)
 - o Health Care/Insurance
 - o FOOD
 - o Entertainment/Misc.
- When the Stipend Just Isn't Enough
 - Option A: Sweet talk mom & dad (selling point: education is an investment!)
 - Option B: Financial Aid! (located in Clifton Robinson Tower)
 - Step One: File your FAFSA www.fafsa.ed.gov
 - Step Two: Get Approved: Receive a BU Financial Aid Packet
 - Step Three: Decide how much money you REALLY need
 - Step Four: Apply for Loans & Online Student Loan Counseling
 - http://mappingyourfuture.org/Graduate (great resource!)
 - Step Five: Receive your money \$: Goes to cover your Fees first, THEN you get the beloved REFUND!
 - Step Six: Making it last a WHOLE semester! Get Thrifty!

Where Do I Live? Finding On/Off-Campus Housing

- Off-Campus Housing (SO MANY OPTIONS & PRICES!)
 - Baylor Web site: List of off-campus apartments/condos/rentals/etc., & roommate finder http://www.baylor.edu/offcampushousing/
 - BearCribs: Virtual Tours, Pricing & Amenities info for almost every complex near campus http://www.bearcribs.com/
 - o Ask current cohort members! Where do they live, what are the reputations of certain places, etc.
- What to Look for in Housing Options
 - o How close is it to campus? (Is it a safe walk to campus?)
 - o Does it included cable, internet, utilities, washer/dryer, alarm system
 - o Is the price by the ROOM or for the full apartment?
 - Do they allow pets? (cost extra?)
 - o Is it furnished?
- Who Do I Live With (I don't know anyone!)?
 - Finding roommates—Baylor/Truett/Law students, Let your Apt. Match you, OR your cohort http://www.baylor.edu/offcampushousing/index.php?id=000610

Getting around Campus (walk, jog, run...O wait, that's the BearTrail!)

- Car: \$225 for student parking pass (apply online before you arrive http://www.baylor.edu/parking/
 - o Save \$: Cohort Carpooling
- **Bike**: Live close enough to campus, plenty of bike racks & eco-friendly © Can sometimes find cheap used bikes on CraigsList or at Thrift shops
- **Baylor Shuttle** (it's FREE, goes all over campus, & runs every weekday) http://www.baylor.edu/bus/



Other Stuff to Get Done Before the Big Move!

- The Baylor "Bear" Necessitates
 - o Send in your FINAL transcripts to the Graduate School after graduation
 - o Register for Classes! (Just Kidding! Julie Baker does it for us! YAY!)
 - Health forms: All incoming students must complete and return a Health Form to Health Services BEFORE CLASSES START! If you have been enrolled recently at Baylor, you may not need to complete a new health form, (254)710-1010 Download @ http://www.baylor.edu/content/services/document.php/78331.pdf
 - o Insurance (If you are off your parents' plan, Baylor can provide you with health insurance.) http://www.baylor.edu/health_center/index.php?id=13935

Cohort Communication

Preparing for your Apprenticeship

- Order your Textbooks: If you buy online, leave at least three weeks (if possible) for shipping.
- Get your Baylor **ID Card** (Clifton Robinson Tower)
