Advocacy Teams: Students who are on an advocacy team during the summer quarter must register for two hours of advocacy team credit. If you are on a team, you must submit a completed Advocacy Team Registration form to the Registrar. Students are limited to taking 8 hours of credit for advocacy teams (each team is worth two hours of credit). Independent Studies in Law
