Dr. Rinn Cloud has joined Baylor University as the Mary Gibbs Jones Endowed Chair in Textile Science. She comes most recently from Florida State University where she served on the faculty for 15 years. Prior to that she held positions at Virginia Tech University and Louisiana State University. A native of Baton Rouge, LA, Dr. Cloud is a graduate of LSU, Purdue University, and the University of North Carolina Greensboro. She teaches textile science courses and conducts textile product development research related to variety of types of functional apparel such as surgical



gowns, ballistic vests, posture support garments, dance wear, and sports apparel. She is currently conducting a project to improve the protective and comfort features of beekeeper coveralls.

A Christian since she was nine years old, Dr. Cloud likewise has a long history working with college age and singles Sunday School departments in her former churches. She also plays handbells and is looking forward to finding a church in Waco where she can get involved in these ministries. Dr. Cloud, a widow since 1999, has three sons, a daughter, and three grandchildren. She spent much of the summer coordinating her

Now called Jodi Arnold to signal that they are more than customer friendly but actually customer-centric. Every season their customer can expect unique details and interpretations they won't find everywhere.

In addition to her apparel company, Jodi has opened retail stores in the Village and Brooklyn where she sells her apparel and shares the retail space with emerging or established photographers, artists, or other creative people who are passionate, dynamic, and interesting.

Most recently Jodi has designed and released a Jodi Arnold line of apparel, which is being sold in The Limited stores. According to a Limited spokesperson, Jodi has brought a soft femininity and worldly fashion-forward bent to the clothing chain with her passion for global culture, and a love of soft textiles and embellishments.

Three **Fashion Design** students placed in this year's 43rd Annual Career Day National competition. Career Day is the longest running and largest fashion career competition of its kind in the US. **Meg Quinius Robinson** received a scholarship and placed second with her wool coat and dress. **Anna Morrison** also won a scholarship and second place for her trend board. And, **Kaylyn Smith** won second place and a scholarship for her entry in the Four Legged Fashion (FLF): Canine Meets Couture category. The FLF competition required students to design and create a garment for their favorite canine companion. The best FLF entries joined designs from national designers for the FLF fund raising auction. Proceeds from the auction went into the FLF fund to benefit animal rescue organizations.

And, **Elizabeth Brower**, a **Child & Family Studies** major was awarded Outstanding Undergraduate Student Paper Award at the 2010 Texas Council on Family Relations conference.

New full time lecturer - Dr. Mary Simpson

Dr. Mary Simpson recently received her doctorate in education from Baylor University. She has taught at Baylor for the past seven years and was previously employed by Iowa State University and the University of Texas at Austin. Additionally, she has owned a visual merchandising consulting business and an extremely successful national franchise. Engaged in the study of creativity from a developmental and an application viewpoint, Dr. Simpson has presented her research findings at national and international conferences. Research activity

In addition to being dedicated to their teaching responsibilities, our faculty have been busy conducting, publishing, and presenting research in their respective fields. Undergraduate research

Undergraduate Research (URSA) has become an important component for our research activities and future plans. **Amanda Seybold**, a FCS-Child and Family Studies major who graduated in May 2010, had quite an experience with the research process in the last two years she was at Baylor. Amanda worked with Dr. Janet Crow developing and carrying out a research project funded through a Baylor Undergraduate Research and Academic Achievement grant. She assisted in all aspects of a study designed to explore the relationships between military parents' deployment histories and military middle-school adolescents' perceptions of family functioning, social support, anger frequency, and anger management techniques. Results of the study indicated that parents' and adolescents' perceptions of these variables were quite different and that anger frequency was related to the father's deployment history and the adolescent's perceptions of family functioning. Amanda had the opportunity to share results in three venues; in a poster presentation during Baylor's Undergraduate Research week, in a session of the Texas Council on Family Relations 2010 Conference, and in an article to be published in the Texas Association of Family and Consumer Sciences Research Journal.

Rising young professionals

Faculty in each of our six program areas select outstanding students each year as the rising young professionals in their academic program. At the end of the academic year one student is identified as the one 'Outstanding Student' for all FCS programs. Individuals identified by their program faculty are showcased by having their picture displayed in the building and with special recognition at the end of school celebration. Europe study abroad

Drs. Bowen, Divita, Brunson, and Mrs. Brown along with 23 students and one guest spent 16 days studying within their disciplines in France, Belgium, and the United Kingdom. Highlights of the trip included: a tour of Versailles, a visit to Monet's Gardens in Giverny, a visit to the newly completed Ralph Lauren flagship retailer in Paris, a walking tour of Art Nouveau architecture in both Brussels and Antwerp, visits to various showrooms and museums (MOMU, outstanding fashion museum in the heart of Antwerp was a special treat), attending lectures by experts in each discipline, a visit to Bernard Thorpe--a hand screen printing textile mill, a tour of the Lochcarron Mill in Edinburgh, famous for the production of the Scottish tartans. All



participants immersed themselves in other cultures for both a successful and memorable learning experience while

juggling the various weather changes, navigating multiple means of transportation, and shifting currencies.

Piper Center for Family studies & child development

This past year has been very exciting at Piper. Looking back we have had amazing times! The staff have focused on learning and implementing Conscious Discipline (CD). CD is "a comprehensive social and emotional intelligence classroom management program that empowers both teachers and children with a goal to provide systematic changes in classrooms by fostering the emotional intelligence of teachers first and child second." (Bailey, 2000, p.11). Conscious Discipline is strong on building community in the classroom, relationships between teacher and child, and children. The "school family" is the center of the program. Rituals are very important to promote brain development and build the bonds needed for success. After over 60 hours of training, everyone is doing well using Conscious Discipline and the children are certainly learning that "It is my teacher's job to keep me safe, and it is my job to help her do that."

Two teachers at Piper, Frances Koen and Erin Jacobus, are providing mentoring in the community



at childcare centers to improve the quality of child care for all children. Our teachers are in great demand to train for Smart Start, the local Child Care Association in Waco. Candice Coulter, Anna Burton, and Erin Jacobus will be presenting at Texas Association for the Education of Young Children (TAEYC) in Austin this September. All of the teachers will attend two days of the three-day conference.

Janet Jones, Stephanie Adams, and Candice Coulter attended the National Zero to Three Conference last December. Anna Burton and Erin Jacobus attended the Frog Street Press National Conference in Grapevine this summer. Frances Koen attended the first week of Conscious Discipline Training this summer to become a certified CD trainer. This will be great to have our "in house" CD trainer. Barbara Crosby, director of Piper, was trained this summer in the Program for Infant/Toddler Care (PITC).

Highlight visitors this past year at Piper included Waco fire and police departments and our very special guest in June was Baylor's new first lady, Mrs. Alice Starr.

"I think it helps them not only communicate, but also develop faster emotionally," says

Adams. "We taught them signs for feelings, like 'happy,' 'sad,' and 'frustrated.' Before they could talk, instead of throwing a tantrum, the kids could just let me know how they felt with sign language." Adams has been working with this group of children for 18 months, starting when they were six months old with the signs "eat," "more," and "all done". Waco Touchpoints Coalition

Child and Family Studies program took the role of lead agency in the Waco Touchpoints Coalition. The coalition is comprised of 15 area agencies that serve young children and their families. The purpose of this project is to address

the needs of families with young families by providing an intensive longitudinal professional development program to implement the Touchpoints Approach among professionals who interact with parents of young children.



The implementation of this program will positively impact young children and parents through a strength-based, relational approach that empowers parents and other caregivers. Thousands of low income children (age birth to 3 and their families in the Greater Waco area are in need of developmental, parenting, social, and other services. To reach this target population, this initiative includes three broad phases: 1) training providers who work with parents and children; 2) conducting research and staging intervention (e.g., needs assessment, outcomes); and 3) implementing strategically planned community development partnerships that build upon existing strengths of partner organizations.

Baylor FCS hosts Texas Council on Family Relations

The FCS department hosted the 2010 annual Texas Council on Family Relations. The theme



was "Promoting Healthy Families; Changing Families in Changing Times". The conference,

which was coordinated by Dr. Tyler Horner, was a great success -- numerous FCS faculty and students gave presentations, workshops, and scientific posters. Over 100 professionals from around the state attended, and an additional 100 Baylor students attended.

Fashion student finalist in International Competition

Lizvette Damman, Houston fashion design senior was selected as one of five finalist in the international Design Your Future contest coordinated by the Hispanic Association of Colleges and Universities and The Gap. 
Alumni spotlight Child & Family Studies
