Public and private companies included in the <u>Million Dollar Directory</u> have a net worth of \$500,000. A Dun's company listing contains the company logo (if available), an indication of ownership (a black triangle by the company's name denotes public ownership), a reference to trade activity, a list of subsidiaries, company annual sales, product line and SIC code, name executives, company's addresses, etc.

Standard and Poor's <u>Register of Corporations</u>, <u>Directors</u>, and <u>Executives</u> Ref <u>HG 4057 .A4</u> <u>S&P Register</u> is arranged in three volumes: Volume I contains corporate listings; Volume II contains directors and executives; and Volume III contains indexes which include a product index with SIC codes, a numerical division and SIC codes, a geographic index, corporate family index, obituary index, new executives and companies index.

Each entry in <u>Wards</u> includes the company name, company mailing address, phone number, chief executive, company type (private or publicly held), four digit SIC code, alpha description of industry, import/export status, year founded, total company sales, and number of employees.

Selected Databases

ABI/Inform (ProQuest)

Indexes 1000 worldwide business periodicals -- many full text -- covering topics such as advertising, marketing, economics, human resources, finance, taxation, computers, etc. Also provides information on 60,000+ companies.

Business & Company Resource Center (GaleGroup-- InfoTrac)

Formerly General BusinessFile ASAP, this resource brings together in a single database company profiles, company brand information, rankings, investment reports, company histories, chronologies, and periodicals.

Business Source Premier (EBSCOHost)

Indexes scholarly business journals covering management, economics, finance, accounting, international business, and much more. About 80% of the journals are available with full text.

Lexis/Nexis Academic

The business component of Lexis-Nexis Academic UNIVerse includes company, country, financial, demographic, market research and industry reports. Approximately 120,000 new articles are added each day from worldwide newspapers, magazines, news wires and trade journals. Many of the resources found in Lexis/Nexis UNIVerse are available in full text.

Mergent Online

Glossary

Bond - a certificate of contractual of debt

Common Stock – a security that represents ownership in a corporation

Futures – contracts covering the sale of commodities, options, or financials for future delivery executed on a regulated futures exchange

Junk bond – a slang term applied to corporate bond issues that are high speculative and carry a high degree of market risk

Mutual fund – an investment company that pools money from shareholders and invests in a variety of securities, including stocks, bonds, and money market securities

Option – a security position that gives the holder the right to buy or sell a fixed amount of shares – usually 100 – at a given price within a specified period of time. If the time period expires without the option being exercised, the investor loses the trade privileged and forfeits the money paid for it.

Preferred stock – a class of stock entitled to dividend payments – frequently expressed as a percentage of par value – before dividend payouts are made to common stockholders

Unit investment trust – a specialized kind of front-end load plan consisting of a package of bonds, either corporate or municipal. The investor buys units of bonds which cost \$1,000 each and in return receives a certificate attesting to ownership of so many units.
