NSF funds a large number of research opportunities for undergraduate students through its REU Sites program. An REU Site consists of a group of ten or so undergraduates who work in the research programs of the host institution. Each student is associated with a specific research project, where he/she works closely with the faculty and other researchers. Students are granted stipends and, in many cases, assistance with housing and travel. Undergraduate students supported with NSF funds must be citizens or permanent residents of the United States or its possessions. An REU Site may be at either a US or foreign location.

Department of Defense SMART Scholarships. The Science, Mathematics And Research for Transformation (SMART) Scholarship for Service Program has been established by the Department of Defense (DoD) to support undergraduate and graduate students pursuing degrees in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) disciplines. In order to increase the number of U.S. citizens and nationals trained in science and engineering disciplines of military importance, the Department of Defense (DoD) awarded approximately 200 new three-year graduate fellowships in April 2011. The DoD fellowships focus on individuals who have demonstrated the ability and special aptitude for advanced training in science and engineering. National Defense Science and Engineering Graduate (NDSEG) Fellowships are awarded to applicants who will pursue a doctoral degree in, or closely related to, an area of DoD interest within one of the fifteen following disciplines:

Rotary International World Peace Fellows. This extraordinary program is still very new and the due dates may vary from one region to another. You are not eligible to apply until you have had several years of experience beyond the undergraduate level. Rotary Peace Fellows are leaders promoting national and international cooperation, peace, and the successful resolution of conflict throughout their lives, in their careers, and through service activities. Fellows can earn either a master's degree in international relations, public administration, sustainable development, peace studies, conflict resolution, or a related field, or a professional development certificate in peace and conflict resolution.

The centers are located in Thailand, at Duke/Chapel Hill, at International Christian University in Tokyo, Japan; at Universidad del Salvador in Buenos Aires, Argentina; at University of Bradford, in England; at University of California at Berkeley; and at University of Queensland in Brisbane, Australia.
