Baylor Bound Transfer Program Agreement Baylor University And Collin County Community College District

In order to ease the process of transferring students and to foster academic relationships between both institutions, Collin County Community College District ("Collin College") and Baylor University ("Baylor") agree to the following "Baylor Bound Transfer Program Agreement":

- 1. Students may declare their intent to transfer to Baylor by submitting the Baylor Bound Transfer Program application at any point after enrollment at any Collin College campus following high school graduation. This allows Collin College and Baylor to identify students who are interested in enrolling at Baylor and to help guide them through the transfer process.
- 2. A student's formal application for admission to Baylor will be activated when the student has completed the Baylor application for admission. Baylor's official admissions decision will be made after all appropriate documents have been received and reviewed by Baylor.* Baylor agrees to send Collin College a list of the Baylor Bound Transfer Program applicants on a monthly basis.
- 3. Collin College and Baylor will provide appropriate transfer equivalency guides to identify courses which may transfer to Baylor. Baylor Bound Transfer Program students will have the opportunity to access the Degree Requirements Guide on the web to select appropriate courses to take at Collin College and to contact a Baylor academic advisor prior to transferring. If a student changes majors, it is the student's responsibility to determine if the equivalent course applies to a specific degree requirement by checking the Degree Requirements Guide or by contacting the academic advisor in the appropriate school or college.
- 4. Faculty and administration at Collin College and Baylor may collaborate to initiate and update program-appropriate articulation agreements when mutually deemed necessary. When satisfactory to both parties, these articulation agreements will be made available to Collin College students through both institutions' websites.
- 5. Baylor will make available to Baylor Bound Transfer Program students information about scholarships for transfer students.
- 6. Baylor will provide Baylor Bound Transfer Program students expanded opportunities to learn more about Baylor through special mailings, scheduled Collin College visits by Baylor representatives available only to University Partners such as Baylor, and hosted on-campus events for Collin College students interested in transferring to Baylor.
- 7. Baylor will grant each student participating in the Baylor Bound Transfer Program who is formally admitted to Baylor the opportunity to register early for summer and/or fall classes and to attend the earliest transfer orientation session.
- 8. Collin College can utilize the Baylor Library System through the interlibrary Loan Agreement (http://www.baylor.edu/bookloan) on behalf of the Baylor Bound Transfer Program students.
- 9. Administrators representing Collin College as well as administrators representing Baylor will meet or confer as needed to assess this agreement and develop additional options.

10. Consistent with FERPA regulations, officials from Collin College and Baylor will collaborate to share disaggregated statistical information about students, including participants still enrolled at Collin College, participants who have enrolled at Baylor, and participants who graduate from Baylor.

This agreement shall become effective August 1, 2007, and shall remain in effect until terminated in writing by either party.

*Please note the following:

- For current admission requirements, visit the Admission Services website (http://www.baylor.edu/admissions/). Certain majors, colleges/schools and departments may also require a higher GPA and/or portfolio/recital/audition-based admission.
- All course work that a student takes at Collin College will be evaluated for equivalent transfer credits by the Admission Services Office, not necessarily for degree requirements.
- A grade of 'C' or better must be earned in all courses transferred to Baylor; this work does not alter the Baylor GPA. Courses taken pass/fail will not be eligible for transfer.
- Vocational, technical or Workforce Education Credit (WECM) courses are not accepted for transfer credit.
- No course at or above the '3000' level may be taken at a junior or community college, and no junior or community college course will be evaluated as an advanced course.
- A maximum of 70 (seventy) semester hours may be transferred from a junior or community college to Baylor.
- Degree credit will <u>not</u> be given for courses taken at another college while concurrently enrolled at Baylor.
