Profile of Non-Returning Undergraduate Students Using National Student Clearinghouse Data Fall 2010 to Fall 2011

Executive Summary

This report contains descriptive information about undergraduate students who were enrolled at Baylor University during Fall 2010 but did not return in Fall 2011.

- Of the 12,284 undergraduates enrolled in Fall 2010, 8,672 (70.6%) returned in Fall 2011, 1,120 (9.1%) did not return, and 2,492 (20.3%) graduated.
- Subsequent enrollment at another institution for the non-returning students was tracked using
 data from the National Student Clearinghouse (NSC). Detailed records containing identifying
 information about the students are only returned by NSC if the student has not blocked that
 information.
- Of the 1,120 undergraduates who did not return, the NSC had Fall 2011 detailed enrollment information on 639 (57.1%) of these students. The largest group of those students tracked by NSC enrolled at four-year public institutions.
- Of those students tracked by NSC, 85 (13.3%) enrolled at McLennan Community College in Fall 2011.
- In general, students who retained at Baylor had higher entrance test scores and high school quartiles than those students who did not return.

Detailed Report

This report contains descriptive information about undergraduate students who were enrolled at Baylor University during Fall 2010 but did not return in Fall 2011. Included in this report is information about the following topics:

There were 12,284 undergraduate students enrolled in Fall 2010. Of these students, 8,672 (70.6%) enrolled in Fall 2011 and 1,120 (9.1%) did not return. The remaining 2,492 (20.3%) graduated from the university. In order to seek additional information on the students who did not return, the Office of Institutional Research & Testing (IRT) submitted a file of these students to the National Student Clearinghouse (NSC). The NSC is a national repository of student records used for student degree and enrollment verification. The "Student Tracker" service from the NSC enables institutions to tap the nation's largest enrollment database and track where students ultimately enroll. Student Tracker provides enrollment data from more than 3,300 institutions representing over 92% of national postsecondary enrollment.

This report contains information only on non-returning undergraduate students for which IRT received detailed subsequent enrollment records from NSC. If a student has placed a block on their information, the NSC does not return detailed records for that student. IRT submitted the file of the 1,120 non-returning undergraduate students. The NSC had Fall 2011 enrollment information on 639 (57.1%) of these students. NSC provided information for each of these students including institution of matriculation, matriculation dates, institution type, and institution location.

The largest group of the non-returning students tracked using the NSC data enrolled in four-year public institutions. Table 1 breaks down enrollment by type of institution.

Appendix I contains detailed information for the Fall 2010 undergraduate students who returned to Baylor in Fall 2011 compared to those who did not return. The entire population of non-returning students (1,120) is examined as well as those students who were tracked by NSC according to institution type as defined in Table 1. Appendix II contains detailed information for students who enrolled at one of the top four transferring institutions as tracked by NSC.

Table 2 provides a summary of biographic and demographic information for Fall 2010 undergraduates who returned to Baylor in Fall 2011 compared to students who did not return to Baylor. See Appendix I for details. A smaller percentage of students who did not return were female (51.3%) compared to students who reenrolled at Baylor (57.9%). A larger percentage of students who did not return were minorities (44.2%) compared to students who returned to Baylor (33.6%). A smaller percentage of students who did not return were Baptist (31.9%) as compared to those students who returned to Baylor (35.3%).

Table 3 provides a summary of academic information for Fall 2010 undergraduates who returned to Baylor in Fall 2011 compared to students who did not return to Baylor. See Appendix I for details. The average SAT score of students who returned to Baylor was higher (1210) than the average SAT score of students who did not return to Baylor (1166). A larger percentage of students who returned to Baylor were in the first quartile of their high school (71.9%) than those students who did not return to Baylor (55.7%).

Table 5 provides a summary of biographic and demographic information for Fall 2010 undergraduates who returned to Baylor in Fall 2011 compared to non-returning students who enrolled at the top four transferring institutions. See Appendix II for details. A smaller percentage of students who returned to Baylor in Fall 2011 were minorities (33.6%) than the percentages of minorities that transferred to McLennan Community College, Lone Star College System District, University of Houston, or University of North Texas.

Table 6 provides a summary of academic information for Fall 2010 undergraduates who returned to Baylor in Fall 2011 compared to non-returning students who enrolled at the top four transferring institutions. See Appendix II for details. The average SAT score of students who returned to Baylor in Fall 2011 (1210) was higher than the average SAT score of students who enrolled at McLennan Community College, Lone Star College System District, University of Houston, University of North Texas. A larger percentage of students who returned to Baylor in Fall 2011 (71.9%) were in the first quartile of their high school than those who enrolled at one of the top four transferring institutions.
