- Concentration: Nine semester hours from one of the following concentrations. One course in the concentration
 must be taken at the 4000 level:
 - 1. **Bible**: One course from REL 4302, 4305, 4315; two courses from REL 3301, 3303, 3304, 3311, 3312, 3314, 3315, 4302, 4305, 4315
 - 2. **Christian Ethics**: One course from REL 3351 or 3390 (the course not taken in the required semester above); two courses from REL 3394, 4390, 4393, 4395, 4397
 - 3. History: One course from each REL (3338, 3344, 4338); REL (4331, 4332, 4333); REL (4334, 4335, 4336, 4340)
 - 4. Practical Studies: REL 4340: two courses from 2480, 3381, 3382
- Theology: One course from REL 3351 or 3390 (the course not taken in the required semester above);
 one course from 4350, 4351, 4352, 4353, 4354, 4388;
 one additional course from REL 3352, 3370, 4350, 4351, 4352, 4353, 4354, 4388
 - 6. World Religions: Three courses REL 4343, 4346, 4348.
- REL Elective: Students may take any level excluding 1211, 1221, 1231, 1241, 1310, 1350.
- REL 4000-level: Students must take three semester hours of an additional 4000-level religion elective
- Recommended electives: courses in biblical languages, church-state studies, communication studies, economics, English literature, history, journalism, philosophy, political science, psychology, and sociology.
- A grade of "C" or better in religion courses used for the major.

Biology/Chemistry Prerequisite Policies

Biology- In order to register for BIO 1305 and 1306, students must have either a satisfactory math score on the ACT or SAT OR have completed MTH 1304 (Pre-Calculus) with a grade of B or better.

Chemistry- In order to register for CHE 1301, students must have either a satisfactory math score on the ACT or SAT or have a minimum grade of B in CHE 1300 AND a minimum grade of B in either MTH 1304 (Pre-Calculus) or MTH 1321 (Calculus)
