


In order to move test questions from MicroTest to Respondus, you must first export your questions from MicroTest and create a text file.

Exporting from the MicroTest Quick Start Menu


1. From the Quick Start menu, click "Export Questions":




2. Click on either "Open Existing Test" or "Use Creating a New Test Quick Start":



3. Select "Text or RTF File" as your export format and click "Next":




4. Click "Finished":




- 5. Choose the proper export format:

 - For File Format, choose "With Tabs and Returns"
 - Choose "Yes" to include the Answer Key

Click OK




6. Name the file, making note of the name and location, and click "Save":



Manually Editing the Export File for Respondus

Respondus will not accept a .txt file in the format MicroTest uses for export. In order to import your questions into Respondus, you must manually edit the document you just created.

1. First, open the MicroTest export document you just created:


Importing Test Questions into Repsondus

Once you have the document in the correct format, you will be able to import it into Respondus.


1. Open Respondus and click on "Import Questions":




2. Choose the appropriate file type from the drop down menu:




3. Click "Browse."




4. Select the file and click "Open":




5. Name the new document you are creating in Respondus:
