- Send the Office of the Registrar official transcripts for dual credit or transfer credit.

- Be sure you can access all of your classes through <u>Blackboard</u> or <u>Canvas</u>.
- Take the <u>MAP-Works Assessment</u> to learn about how your academic performance matches up to your goals, beginning September 10.
- Prepare for <u>Academic Advising</u> for Spring registration.

Financial:

- Apply for Work Study.
- You can access your <u>E-Bill</u> and <u>set up authorized users</u> for your Baylor Cashier's Account.
- You can also purchase or refill your <u>BearBucks</u>.

Development:
