We also spent several months supporting the Maryland Network Against Domestic Violence's efforts to pass legislation which would insure that Team members could share essential information about cases without penalty. This legislation, Maryland HB 741, was passed into law in April and became effective on July, 1, 2005. The Case Screening Committee, comprising of the Calvert Investigatiave Team (Maryland State Police and Calvert Sheriff's Office), the State's Attorney's Office, and the DVFRT Chariperson, and other interested Team members, met several times to preview domestic violence cases that have resulted in deaths or near deaths. We will have our first meeting to review these cases on September 7, 2005.</p>

A plan has been developed to have a City Attorney located within the police department to review all domestic case reports from the previous day for the sole purpose of appropriately classifying the case for prosecution. They currently have a grant funded position solely for this purpose. *One of the recommendations from the work of the review team was to strengthen the penalties on domestic violence cases that involved strangulation. In 2005 the Minnesota state legislature changed the state law on strangulation to make strangulation in the state of Minnesota a felony. Perpetrators of domestic violence often flee before police arrive. With proper training law enforcement officers were able to double the number of arrests of perpetrators who were gone upon arrival. *Children are frequently the targets of perpetrators and the city of Minneapolis has now developed a model policy and procedure for staff

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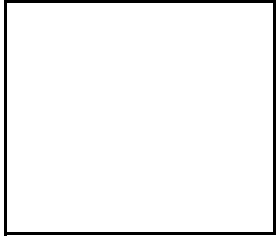
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
