Fall 2006

The class of 2,783 first-year students includes students who entered the University during Summer 2006 and Fall 2006. Sixty-two percent of the class are females, and 24 percent are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation comprise approximately 42 percent of the group, while 13 percent are Non-Denominational and just under 13 percent are Catholic.

Ninety-seven percent of these students are United States citizens, while 72 (2.5%) are resident or nonresident aliens representing 29 foreign countries. By domicile, as reflected in the students' permanent addresses, the class of first-year students is comprised of students from 45 states. Approximately 80 percent of the first-year students are from Texas.

Among students with high school class ranking, 70 percent were in the top quartile of their high school graduating classes. The score range for the middle fifty percent of the entering first-year class is 1110 – 1310 with a mean score of 1213 for the Recentered SAT and 23 – 28 with a mean score of 25 for the Enhanced ACT examination.

Fall 2005

The class of 3,168 first-year students includes those students who entered the University during Summer 2005 and Fall 2005. Fifty-nine percent of the class are females, and 31 percent are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation comprise approximately 38 percent of the group, while 15 percent are Catholic and 14 percent are Non-Denominational.

Ninety-seven percent of these students are United States citizens, while 103 (3.2%) are resident or nonresident aliens representing 30 foreign countries. By domicile, as reflected in the students' permanent addresses, the class of first-year students is comprised of students from 41 states. Approximately 81 percent of the first-year students are from Texas.

Among students with high school class ranking, 67 percent were in the top quartile of their high school graduating classes. The score range for the middle fifty percent of the entering first-year class is 1100 – 1290 with a mean score of 1196 for the Recentered SAT and 22 – 27 with a mean score of 25 for the Enhanced ACT examination.
