Fall 2006

The graduate enrollment of 1,278 includes 9 students classified as Graduate Nondegree. There are 503 new graduate students. Just over forty-seven (47.3) percent of the graduate enrollment are males, and 26.1 percent are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Of the 1,141 students for whom religious affiliation data were available, 37.5% are affiliated with the Baptist denomination.

Eighty-six percent of these students are United States citizens, while 184 (14.4%) are resident or nonresident aliens, representing 49 foreign countries. The score range for the middle fifty percent of graduate students is 1040 - 1270 with a mean of 1154 for the Graduate Record Examination (GRE) and 530 - 630 with a mean of 577 for the Graduate Management Admission Test (GMAT).

Fall 2005

The graduate enrollment of 1,214 includes 10 students classified as Graduate Nondegree. There are 412 new graduate students. Just over forty-nine (49.2) percent of the graduate enrollment are males, and 27.3 percent are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Of the 1,058 students for whom religious affiliation data were available, 37.8% are affiliated with the Baptist denomination.

Eighty-four percent of these students are United States citizens, while 197 (16.2%) are resident or nonresident aliens, representing 48 foreign countries. The score range for the middle fifty percent of graduate students is 1010 - 1250 with a mean of 1133 for the Graduate Record Examination (GRE) and 530 - 640 with a mean of 582 for the Graduate Management Admission Test (GMAT).
