Family and Consumer Sciences Welcomes Dr. Joyce Nuner Child Development Studies

We are pleased to welcome Dr. Joyce Nuner to the Department of Family and Consumer Sciences at Baylor University. She comes to us from the University of Texas at Tyler where she has taught in the Department of Early Childhood, Reading, and Special Education for the past two years. While at UT Tyler, Dr. Nuner taught courses in Creativity, Play, and Learning, Infant and Toddler Development, and Early Childhood Curriculum Development. Prior to teaching at the university level, Dr. Nuner worked with a church in The Woodlands in building a preschool ministry. The preschool program, Children of Joy! began serving 68 children the first year of operation and within three years had grown to serve 150 children and their families and had earned accreditation from the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC). She has also taught in public school and private early childhood settings as well as working in administration at Texas Woman's University's laboratory school. Dr. Nuner has a strong interest in advocating for quality, affordability, and availability of early childhood educational environments for young children and their families.

She serves on the state board of Texas Council on Family Relations and is very involved in several national organizations that advocate for young children.

Dr. Nuner earned her doctorate degree in Family Studies from Texas Woman's University. Her dissertation research was a qualitative investigation on the Mothers-in-law/ Daughters-in-law relationships. Her Master is in Humans Sciences with an emphasis in Child Development and Family Studies and her Bachelors is in Interdisciplinary Studies, Early Childhood Education. She completed both degrees from Stephen F. Austin State University. Dr. Nuner has several professional publications and presentations to her credit and she is actively involved in research focusing on family and child care issues while teaching child development courses for the department. She is currently pursuing a course of research that will examine maternal separation anxiety upon their child's entry into childcare. We are thrilled to welcome Dr. Nuner, her husband, Eric, and daughter, Emery, to Waco, and to the Baylor family!
