National Science Foundation Day at the UTSA

The University of Texas at San Antonio and the National Science Foundation will be holding a free, one-day workshop at the University on **Friday**, **January 23, 2004**. All Baylor University personnel who would like to learn more about the NSF and its programs are encouraged to attend.


Representatives from four of the NSF's research directorates will make presentations on their programs and will also be available individually and in breakout sessions for more specific discussions of potential research proposals. The <u>Biological Sciences</u>; <u>Engineering</u>; <u>Social, Behavioral, and Economic Sciences</u>; and <u>Computer & Information Science & Engineering</u> directorates will have representatives at the workshop. There will also be a presentation on the programs of NSF's <u>Office of International Science and Engineering</u>.

Registration is free, but it is required. The <u>agenda and registration form</u> can be downloaded from the Research website. Please register by Monday, January 19, 2004. The NSF Day workshop will be held at the <u>University</u> <u>Center</u> on the UTSA campus. We expect that both those familiar with NSF programs and those who should be will find "NSF Day at UTSA" useful and informative.

Awardees for Final Funding Round of the Faculty Research Investment Program

Recently, Baylor University announced three awardees for the final round of the Faculty Research Investment Program. Dr. Rodney Bowden received funding for his project "Comparison of High Carbohydrate and High Protein Diets Combined with Exercise on Anthropometric Measures and Blood Profiles in Sedentary College Students," Dr. Richard Kreider for "Light Microscope Photodocumentation Technique for Histochemical Assessment of Human Skeletal Muscle," and finally, Dr. Carolyn Skurla for her project entitled "Canine Total Hip Replacement Retrieval Program."

The <u>Faculty Research Investment Program</u> is designed to stimulate research/creative activities and enhance the ability of faculty to compete for external research funds. The next funding cycle for the upcoming fiscal year is tentatively set for May 2, 2004 and early submission is strongly encouraged.
