Appropriations Bill Includes Federal Funding for Baylor **Projects**

The \$388.4 billion Appropriations Bill signed Dec. 8 by President Bush includes more than \$1 million for Baylor University projects supported by Sen. Kay Bailey Hutchison (R-Texas), Rep. Joe Barton (R-6th District), Rep. Chet Edwards (D-11th District) and Rep. Kay Granger (R-12th District). The project funding includes \$400,000 for an assessment of Lake Whitney as a potential drinking water source, \$200,000 for Baylor's Mayborn Museum Complex and its mammoth exhibit and \$500,000 for the GEAR UP Waco college preparation program for at-risk students.

Baylor Partners in \$500,000 Nanotech Workforce Development Initiative

The Texas Workforce Commission has awarded a \$500,000 grant to a statewide partnership led by Texas State Technical College-Waco (TSTC), Baylor University and Zyvex Corp., in which Baylor's Center for Astrophysics, Space Physics and Engineering Research (CASPER) plays a significant role. The Baylor-TSTC partnership, through CASPER's experimental research capability, will provide future nano-manufacturing technicians with research experience as a central part of their preparation for entry into the newly developing nanotechnology manufacturing workforce.

Funding Opportunities for Research and Scholarship

The beginning of the calendar year marks the time when Requests for Proposals (RFP) are issued for submission to the numerous internal funding programs. Baylor's diverse funding opportunities support many aspects of the faculty's research and scholarship efforts, including project-related travel, conference support, postdoctoral fellowships, and seed money for the expansion of knowledge and skills into areas beyond present disciplinary expertise.

We review some of the RFPs to be released in the coming weeks below. Once released, these requests will contain additional information, including specific deadlines and up-to-date application information. Requests for funding should meet the mission of the respective funding program and limited funding is available for all programs. University Research Committee (URC)

The University Research Committee, composed of a cross section of faculty members from various disciplines, is charged with the responsibility of providing funds for the support and development of scholarly research projects and programs. The URC, unlike the targeted funding programs described below, funds the support of wide-ranging research and scholarship endeavors. Faculty Research Investment Program (FRIP)

The Faculty Research Investment Program is designed to stimulate research/creative activities and enhance the ability of faculty to compete for external research funds. As such these funds are primarily used to: purchase equipment or update existing research equipment; aid faculty members in establishing research/creative activity programs that will be competitive for significant external grants; promote multidisciplinary research/creative activities; and/or provide "seed" support for productive faculty members wanting to redirect their scholarly activity within their current area or initiate investigations into new and emerging areas. *Application Deadline: April, 2005; Funding Period: June 1, 2005 to May 31, 2006*

Young Investigator Development Program (YIDP)

Similar to the FRIP, the Young Investigator Development Program is designed to stimulate research/creative activities and is specifically targeted to enhance the ability of <u>newly appointed tenure-track faculty</u> to compete for external research funding. *Application Deadline: April, 2005; Funding Period: June 1, 2005 to May 31, 2006*

Arts and Humanities Faculty Development Program (A&HFDP)

The Arts and Humanities Faculty Development Program is designed to stimulate research, scholarship and creative activities, and promote development of the arts, fine arts, humanities, and education graduate research programs within Baylor University. *Application Deadline: Continuous*

Postdoctoral Fellowship Program

The Office of the Vice Provost for Research supports 12-month postdoctoral research fellowships for Ph.D. granting departments. These postdoctoral research fellowships are funded by the University and have minimal teaching responsibility. Salaries are competitive at a national level. The initial appointments are funded for a period of one year, with application for a second year extension allowed for successful fellows. Candidates must hold a Ph.D. degree and be committed to excellence in research at both the undergraduate and graduate levels.

Application Period: August 15 to October 1, 2005; Funding Commences: June 1, 2006

Faculty Travel Assistance Grants Program

The travel assistance grants program provides tenure/tenure-track faculty and funded PI's with matching funds to help defray the cost of travel to promote or support the development of new or expanded research programs at Baylor. Proposals requesting travel funds for discussing pending proposals with specific funding agencies will be given preference. The deadline is continuous and applications may be submitted at any time during the year. *Application Deadline: Continuous*
