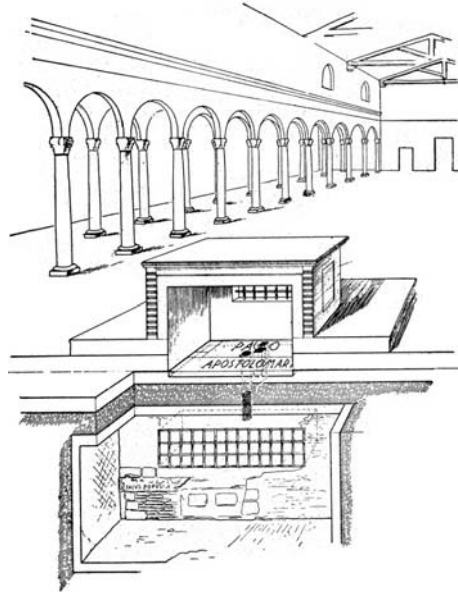

A team of Vatican archaeologists has unearthed the sarcophagus believed to contain the remains of St. Paul the apostle. The tomb is located under St. Paul’s Outside the Walls, Rome’s second largest basilica. Excavations, undertaken beneath the basilica beginning in 2002, were completed in December 2006.
