

IMMORTAL TEN MEMORIAL INSTALLED ON CAMPUS

On June 22, the stunning life-size monument to the Immortal Ten was installed in Traditions Square between Pat Neff Hall and the Bill Daniel Student Center. Renowned western sculptor Bruce Greene of Clifton has done a tremendous job on the memorial, which consists of four life-sized bronze statues along with a panel of the remaining six athletes. The memorial will be officially dedicated at 2 p.m., November 2, during Baylor Homecoming. The project began in 1995 as the project for the senior class gift, led by Chase Palmer, the permanent president for the class of 1996. THE ACADEMY WELCOMES MELISSA SHEHANE


