It is an inscription found on the back left foot of "Joe College," the wonderful and massive new bear sculpture in front of the McLane Student Life Center. PYFER BEAR SCULPTURE IN PLACE AT MCLANE SLC

The bronze sculpture, created by Dr. Douglas W. Crow, professor of German and Sculptor in Residence at Baylor, was installed November 12 (and dedicated November 17) in the island circle in front of the SLC. The massive sculpture rests on a 7 foot granite rock that weighs approximately 30,000 pounds. The Pyfer bear sculpture was funded through a generous gift by Carol Trice Pyfer and her husband, John F. Pyfer, of Lancaster, Pennsylvania.
