Kappa Delta Sorority Promotes Self-Esteem Among Area Girl Scouts

Developed in partnership with the Dove Campaign for Real Beauty, the Dove/Girl Scout Uniquely ME! program strives to help girls ages 8 to 17 recognize and embrace their unique talents, strengths, and abilities. The Epsilon Chi Chapter of Kappa Delta at Baylor University strives to uphold the goals set forth by the campaign while working with a local Girl Scout troop in Waco, TX.

Founded in 1897, Kappa Delta Sorority adopted Girl Scouts of the USA as a national philanthropy in 1998 to offer mentoring and leadership development to Girl Scouts. Countless girls have participated in Kappa Delta-sponsored events such as self-esteem workshops, campus tours, community service projects, badge-earning activities and holiday parties.

The ladies of Kappa Delta at Baylor University were excited to give Girl Scouts in the community the opportunity to participate in the Homecoming Parade last fall. The girls walked in the parade distributing candy with chapter members.

"It was so much fun to be able to share the experience of walking in the parade with the girls. They were all so excited to pass out candy - and to eat some along the way, too!" senior Mackenzie Butcher said.

This past December, members of the chapter also helped out with the Girl Scouts' Christmas Arts and Crafts Night. They helped the girls and other members of their families paint ornaments and decorate crafts for the holidays.

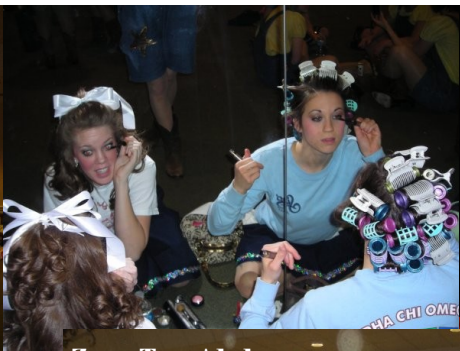
