## 24-Hour Computer Schedule Starts Sept. 9

The Prichard Family Information Commons and the Moody Garden Level Computer Facility will begin their 24-hour schedule on the evening of Sunday, Sept. 9. These study areas will open every Sunday at 1 pm and remain open until Friday night at 9:30 pm until the end of the semester. They will also continue their regular Saturday hours from 9 am to 9:30 pm. Prior to Sept. 9, these areas close 30 minutes before the library closes each night.

Please note that in order to accommodate the slowest hours of business for the Information Commons as well as the most difficult staffing hours, the Laptop Checkout Desk in the IC will actually close each week-night while the IC study area remains open to patrons according to the 24-hour schedule.
