Personnel

Students Assistants

Grace Chiuri. Although Grace is teaching Swahili this semester, she likes working here too much to leave us completely. So she is working five hours a week on the Platt campaign materials, especially campaign posters, 3-D items, and campaign buttons.

Michael Holdridge. M2 added several additional photographs to the Guttery book and began final editing before publication. He also updated statistics from 2002-2006 and designed a cover for the book.

NOTE: At one time, congressional case files were commonly sent to the archives. However, with the passing of the Right to Privacy Act, these records are not open for research until 75 years after the death of the constituent who wrote them. So practically speaking, it is no longer an efficient use of resources to store these records. Most archives no longer accept these type files.

Ben visited the Robert J. Dole Institute of Politics in Lawrence, Kansas on August 15. The Institute has a state of the art archival facility. It is planning to increase the number of archivists processing the 4,000 linear feet of Senator Dole's papers. The visit was interesting and informative. Ben would like to see the Poage Library expand its vision as a research destination similar to the Dole Institute.

Projects

Book Vault Project. HVAC installation will take place sometime this fall. Additional shelving will be ordered as funds are available.

Cartoon exhibit. Ben met with Bob Darden on Aug. 6 to select cartoons for the exhibit. Bob and Ben also met with John Wilson to discuss budgeting and funding challenges, possibilities and opportunities. On Aug. 28, Ben met with Bob, Bill Hair and Sherry Cook to discuss placement of the cartoons in Moody/Jones. Delores Oliver is also working with us to find a museum studies graduate student who can work on the details of the exhibit. Ben also received an estimate from Brazos Oaks of about \$4,000 for framing the cartoons.

Platt Materials. As he approaches age 80, Dr. Platt is making plans to close his book and political memorabilia store in the Fort Worth Stockyards in the next few months. As he scales down his holdings, he will continue to send materials to the library. Matthew and Grace will work to keep pace with these new accessions.

Representing Texas. Ben Guttery is contacting BookSurge, a Print-on-Demand (POD) publisher, about printing his book. The book will be listed on Amazon and through other online sources. We will work with Mr. Guttery to obtain copies for The Standing Committee to use as premiums to donors.
