Tip of the Month:

SI (Supplemental Instruction) is a great way to join an organized study group. But what about those classes that have no SI? Form your own group. Here's how to get started. Find 4 or 5 motivated people in the class, ask each to attend an organizational meeting to which each will bring all study notes and review sheets, and come by the Academic Support Programs office, ground level, west wing of the Foster Success Center (Sid Richardson Building), for a stack of study strategy brochures. - **Pay October tuition installment** – To pay your October installment on-line, log in to Bear Web (<http://bearweb.baylor.edu>) and choose "Student & Financial Aid" and then "Cashier." Failure to be current in installment plan payments will result in a Cashier's Office hold preventing registration.
- **Be PROACTIVE now; get help with classes** – Mid-term deficiency reports will be distributed on Monday, October 13th, via Baylor e-mail. Don't wait for your professor(s) to report a deficient grade(s). Make an appointment immediately to discuss your academic status in each class with your professor or an advisor.

If you need ideas on how to improve your grades, an academic learning specialist, within the Paul L. Foster Success Center, can meet with you one-on-one and help you make a specific plan for getting your grades on track before the end of the semester. - **Set an academic advising appointment** - All freshmen, most sophomores, and juniors and seniors in certain majors or programs are required to meet with an academic advisor before they will be cleared to register for spring 2009 classes

later this semester. **Check Bear Web to make sure your major is correct and to see a complete list of your current advising requirements.** You can go to Bear Web, Student & Financial Aid, Advisement, and then Advisement Contact Information to gather specific information about who to contact and where to go to get advised.

Many students are required to see an advisor in more than one area. (Advising areas other than the major could include departments or programs such as Student-Athlete Services, Honors, pre-healthcare, and others.) It is very important to set your advising appointment(s) early. **Go ahead and do it now!**

All **sophomores in the College of Arts and Sciences** are required to be advised before registration. Many of these students are assigned to be advised in the CASA (College of Arts and Sciences) Advisement Office. This office is located on the ground level of Sid Richardson. - **Prepare for registration** - For all classifications, to find out **your assigned day to register** for Spring 2009 classes go to <http://www.baylor.edu/earlyregistrationschedule> .
- **MAP out your academic career** - MAPs (Major Academic Planners) for most majors are available at <http://www.baylor.edu/advising/> and they can be found under “Resources.” The MAPs show a suggested semester-by-semester sequence of courses and are designed to help you graduate in four years (or slightly more for longer programs.) Start writing your academic plan today!

- **Plan Ahead for Fall, Thanksgiving & Semester Breaks**
 - Residence Halls will remain open during Fall & Thanksgiving Break for students with a need to remain on campus. Front desk services and meal service will not be provided during the holiday break. - **Decide on a major** - Career Counseling offers free, one-on-one sessions for students who need assistance in choosing a major. Students can request an appointment by visiting www.baylor.edu/careercounseling
