In simple cartoon style, tells the story of a twelve-year-old English girl's discovery in 1811 of an ichthyosaurus skeleton.

Norworth, Jack. *Take Me Out to the Ball Game*. New York: Little, Brown and Company, 2006. Zeta 796.357 N8955T.

This book is about the historic song Take me Out to the Ball Game and the 1908 baseball game between the New York Giants and the Chicago Cubs. Includes baseball trivia including hand signals and how certain balls are pitched.

Kalman, Maira. *Fireboat: The Heroic Adventures of the John J. Harvey*. New York: G.P. Putnam's Sons, 2002. Zeta 974.7 K1457F.

A fireboat, launched in 1931, is retired after many years of fighting fires along the Hudson River, but is saved from being scrapped and then called into service again on September 11, 2001.
