1. How to make your reading purposeful, strategic, and flexible
2. Why to unlearn everything you know about reading
3. Simple techniques that will instantly increase your reading speed
4. How to shake off the common habits of subvocalization, backskipping, and regression

In this section of the program, you will learn the multiple reading processes, blending all of the techniques you've learned into one habitual process. This section combines topics from the previous two sections and ties them together. There are several reading exercises performed. You will learn to think about what you just read and how much it makes sense to you and how you might apply it to your own situations and job. The reading pyramid is discussed, which includes different intensities and levels of pre-reading, reading, and post-reading activities. The bottom of the pyramid includes reading material such as a newspaper or mail, which require little pre- or post-reading activities. The top of the pyramid may include study materials, which may require some reading and research on your part to familiarize yourself with the content of these study materials. You may decide a post-reading activity of something you didn't understand well in the readings. Or, at a later date, you may choose a selective reread in which you may develop new insights and a new perspective on the reading. These activities help build and form a recall process that creates memory and retention.
