GROUP FIELD TRIP INFO

The Mayborn Museum Complex offers 1-2 hour(s) of programming, depending on the grade level and topic you choose for your group. All of our programs provide the opportunity to touch, explore, and investigate exhibits linked to cultural history and natural science.

- Programs are offered September 8, 2009 through May 28, 2010 (excluding weekends and holidays).
- Maximum group size to reserve a program is not to exceed 6 classes, or 120 students. Please notify us prior to your visit if you have a significant change in the number of kids in your group. Programming will need to be altered for a change in group size.
- ★ Larger groups can be accomodated with self-guided tours.

LOCATION AND TIMES

- ★ All programs are held in the Mayborn Museum Complex at 1300 S. University Parks Dr.
- Programs begin promptly at 9, 9:30, 12, or 12:30. When possible, we will accommodate out-of-town groups by adjusting their tour schedules.

PAYMENT

We offer discounted rates for our school groups.

- ★ We charge a minimum of \$45 for programming up to 15 people. For groups of 15 or more the cost is \$3 per child and \$5 per adult.
- ★ Teachers receive free admission.
- ★ If parents wish to visit the museum during the program time, they must visit the registration desk and show their membership card or pay a discounted rate.
- ★ Payment may be made by check or credit card upon arrival.
- ★ Make checks payable to the Mayborn Museum Complex.
- ★ Refunds over \$25 will be mailed.

CANCELLATIONS AND REFUNDS

- ★ If you need to cancel, call 254-710-7526 as soon as possible so that your time may be given to others.
- ★ A cancellation fee will be charged if you cancel within 3 days of your scheduled visit.

DROP OFF AND PICK-UP

- **★** Arrive 15 minutes early for unloading and group greeting and directions.
- Unfortunately, due to our tight programming schedule, late arrivals may lose part of their program time.
- Buses turn left at the entrance to the domed museum building and follow the lane around to the side of the building to the area marked "Bus Parking" to unload the students.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS:

The following programs are only offered during a designated time of the year. During this time period, these are the only school programs which are offered at the museum. These programs are $1\frac{1}{2} - 2$ hours long.

CHRISTMAS AT THE MAYBORN

The entire museum is decorated for the holidays. Children rotate through several areas of the museum learning the science and history behind Christmas. This program is offered November 30 through December 18.

self-guided walk-through experience

You will be greeted by a Mayborn staff member. During your orientation, you will receive a map of the building. You will then be on your own with your group to explore the museum. Dates are restricted. Please call for more information. (On the restricted dates, a minimum number of children is not required.)

PROGRAMS FOR PRE-K THROUGH 1ST GRADE

Programs for Pre-K through 1st grade children are 1-1½ hours long. The themes capitalize on areas in the museum which are best suited for our younger visitors. While each themed visit introduces children to two or more areas of the museum, it is possible to schedule just one area. All programs are hands-on and participatory.

People and places

(4 yrs. – 1st grade) This program introduces children to the various people and places of the world as well as different means of transportation. A trip around the world for our younger visitors is included.

JUNIOR HISTORIAN

(4 yrs - 2nd grade) 21st century children are transported back to the late 1800's to learn about the Native Americans of this area and the early Texas pioneers.

EXPLORE TOUR

(4 yrs. – 1st grade) In this tour children will rotate through several different areas of the museum and engage in hands-on fun.

PROGRAMS FOR 2nd THROUGH 8th GRADE

Programs for 2nd through 8th grades are $1\frac{1}{2} - 2$ hours long. All programs are adapted to the grade level attending and address TEKS principles. All programs are handson, participatory, and use multiple exhibit areas of the museum (depending on the program and grade level).
