

INSURANCE

All students are required to enroll in a health insurance plan for study abroad arranged by Baylor University. The cost of this insurance is included in the program fee for Baylor in Germany.

ESTIMATED COSTS

Please note that prices pertaining to the trip are tentative and subject to some fluctuation due to the number of students, exact dates of travel, and currency valuation. We make every effort to keep costs as low as possible while maintaining a quality program. If you arrange your own roundtrip flight, that cost will be deducted from your total. Your deposit will be applied to your total cost.

Although nearly all costs for the program are included above, a suggested amount of \$500-700 personal spending money is recommended. This should be sufficient unless you plan to do additional traveling or shopping while in Germany.

APPLICATION

Completed application, German Division scholarship application, and \$500 deposit should be submitted on or before **December 1**. Application available now. **Late applications are accepted, however additional fees may apply due to pre-paid travel costs.** You may have an application interview. Your deposit will be fully refundable if you are not selected for the program or if the program is canceled by Baylor University. Participation is limited and requires group booking, therefore, cancellation on your part will result in the forfeiture of the deposit. Cancellation after April 15 will result in the forfeiture of the deposit and 1/2 of other program fees. German scholarship awards will be announced in **February**. You may apply directly for the Goodrich International scholarship: http://Baylor.edu/study_abroad/index.php?id=48458. Financial aid awards may be applied to Baylor in Germany. All program fees except for tuition are due by **April 15**. Tuition is usually due to the University around June 1.

DESCRIPTION

Dates and Itinerary: *Baylor in Germany* will begin officially in Frankfurt on July 11. We will travel to Berlin and one or more other German cities en route to Dresden. In Dresden you will attend four weeks of intensive language classes at the Technische Universität; classes are small and held in the mornings. Baylor events and discussions in Dresden are planned for afternoons, evenings and weekends with some free time for exploration and travel built into the itinerary.

Program Mission: Students earn six (6) credit hours in language and culture while traveling and studying in Germany with Baylor professors. The time in Germany will be spent in intensive German language and cultural study.

Travel to and from Germany: At least one program representative will fly from Dallas; students have the option of travel with the program representative. However, students may also choose to make their own arrangements to travel to and return from Germany. All participants must meet in Frankfurt July 11 at the designated hotel. *You need a passport to travel to Germany.*

EXCURSIONS

Travel and study in Germany brings abundant opportunities for cultural immersion. Major destinations are Mainz, Weimar, Berlin, Dresden and Prague.

Other excursions may include: Gutenberg Museum, Checkpoint Charlie Museum, Brandenburg Gate, Buchenwald Concentration Camp, porcelain capital Meißen, “Saxony’s Switzerland” National Park, biking and hiking along the Elbe River, soccer games, boat trips, concert visits, lectures, film festivals, and more.

The Elbe Valley is an UNESCO world heritage site and the perfect natural backdrop for the city of Dresden that was founded in 1206. As the former residence of kings and princes, Dresden has incredible museum collections, churches and palaces, and its historical significance is writ large in its various neighborhoods and surrounding towns. Dresden will welcome us for our extended stay and will soon feel like home. It is also within easy travel distance of Poland, the Czech Republic, Leipzig, and Berlin.

COURSES

Baylor in Germany students complete 6 hours of Baylor credit during the program. All courses are co-taught.

GERMAN 3343: Baylor in Germany: The Dresden Experience (3 hours)
Readings, research and discussion relevant to locations of our journey through Germany and 20th Century German Culture. Advanced course work for senior-level German majors will be available.

LANGUAGE CREDIT: Three (3) hours language credit for the language course appropriate to level (2310/2320/advanced).

ACCOMMODATIONS

Baylor students and professors are housed on or near the campus of the University. Other shared accommodations may also be available. Ample and inexpensive meal options, as well as kitchens in the rooms, are available, and a public transportation pass simplifies exploration in Dresden.

BAYLOR TUITION

Students must register for six hours of credit. Summer tuition and administrative fees are paid directly to the University Registrar.

ADMISSIONS

Applicants to the program must have completed one year of college German or the equivalent. Summer tuition must be paid to Baylor University before enrollment is considered complete. Students not currently enrolled at Baylor University should contact the program director regarding application and admission policies.

RESPONSIBILITIES

Baylor University will carry out services rendered by the Division of Admissions and Records. Student advisement and enrollment are provided for all participants on a continuing basis. Applicants must agree to and sign a statement to abide by all regulations governing students of Baylor University concerning classes, related activities, housing and personal conduct, and travel to, in, and from Germany. This will also include a waiver of liability regarding Baylor University and the program directors.
