Tip of the Month:

Be Proactive & Plan for Success Today - Before you do another thing, sit down with a semester calendar and record every major test and assignment. Don't worry about daily reading or homework assignments. Concentrate on the big things. Why now, today even? As you go through this exercise you may see that on October 16th (for example) you have two major tests and a research paper due. Yikes! You realize immediately that you will need to start preparing for these things early on so that you don't find yourself, on October 14th, thinking, "How did this happen?" Instead, if you get a head start, you will be thinking, "Wow, this is not so hard after all!" Remember the 5 P's – "**P**rior **P**lanning **P**revents **P**oor **P**erformance!" August/September To-Do's:

- **Pay September tuition installment** – To pay your September installment online, log in to BearWeb (<http://bearweb.baylor.edu>) and choose "Student & Financial Aid" and then "Cashier."
- **Check/update your contact information via BearWeb** – Baylor officials will use the personal contact information that is in BearWeb to reach you with important information. Keep your contact information up to date. **Please include your cell phone number if that's your main phone contact.** To update your personal information, log in to BearWeb (<http://bearweb.baylor.edu>) and choose "Personal information" to update your contact information.
- **Attend Blackboard Orientation** – Baylor's Electronic Library will be conducting Blackboard Orientation seminars for students next week (August 24 – September 4). The seminar will cover Blackboard basics and target areas that students have struggled with in the past. The one-hour seminars will be held in Moody G32 at 12:00, 1:00, 2:00, 3:00 & 4:00 pm. Seminar attendance is on a first-come, first-serve basis, so you will not have to sign up ahead of time. Documentation of attendance will be provided to each student who attends.

- **Sell back the books you don't need** – Monday, September 7th is the last day for a refund on textbooks from the Baylor Bookstore.

- **Take care of dual credit or transfer work** - If you completed any dual credit or transfer work this summer, make sure Baylor received an official copy of your transcript from that school. Review your degree audit on BearWeb (<http://bearweb.baylor.edu>) to confirm that the credit is showing on your record. This is especially important for sophomores and juniors. If your summer hours are not on your Baylor record you may be grouped with the incorrect classification at registration time. You may be classified as a sophomore instead of as a junior, for example, and *this means that you will not be able to register for spring classes on the junior registration day*. Contact your academic advisor if you have any questions about transfer work and be sure to mention to your advisor during your academic advising appointment any plans you may have for summer school next year.

- **Send in your final official high school transcript** - If you are a new freshman at Baylor and have not requested that your final high school transcript showing date of graduation and final grades be sent to Admission Services, take care of this detail as soon as possible. If Baylor does not receive your final transcript, then Admission Services will place a registration hold on your record and you will be blocked from registering for spring classes on your assigned registration day. - **Prepare for academic advising for Spring 2010 classes** – Yes, it's already time to start thinking about meeting with your academic advisor to select your spring 2010 classes. Advisement for most majors and programs begins in early to mid-September and you will be receiving email messages with instructions about how to set your appointment. Many students are required to be advised before they can register for classes but students in certain majors or programs are encouraged but not required to meet with an advisor prior to registration. Log into BearWeb to verify that your major is listed correctly. Based on what major is shown for you, you'll also have access to detailed information regarding your assigned academic advisor(s). You can review the list of assigned registration dates at <http://www.baylor.edu/registrar/index.php?id=38278>. Be sure to meet with your advisor before your assigned day to register

- **Find out what day you register for Spring 2010 classes** - You may view the Spring 2010 early registration schedule at www.baylor.edu/earlyregistrationschedule . Class offerings for Spring 2010 will be available for viewing via web course listings beginning **September 23**.

- **Look for a Job on Campus** - Visit http://www.baylor.edu/student_employment to review the list of available jobs on campus if you are interested in working part-time this fall. The priority deadline for Federal Work-Study eligible students is September 13th. Beginning September 14th, any Baylor University student who is interested in working on campus may compete for on-campus jobs.
- **Learn about Study Abroad Opportunities** – Baylor offers a wide-variety of study abroad programs around the world. If you are thinking about participating in one of these programs this spring or summer, you need to start making plans now. Here’s how you can get more information:
