Texas State Grants Offer Additional Funding Opportunities

It's important to keep in mind that in addition to making money available through federal agencies, the government also channels funds to the states, allowing state agencies to award targeted funds for a variety of purposes.

Since 2007, the State of Texas has maintained an online datbase of grant opportunities. The database matches a

variety of organizations, including universities, with funds available through state agencies.

Applications are due to the OVPR by October 7, 2009 at 12:00 p.m.

NEH Summer Stipend Applications

Considering applying to the NEH's summer stipend program? Remember that OVPR review is required before applications may be submitted to the NEH. Institutions are limited in the number of applications they may submit. Faculty who submit applications on their own may risk putting Baylor over its allotment of applications, potentially jeopardizing funding for all our applicants.

Although stipends are awarded directly to applicants, it's important that fellowship applications receive academic and administrative approval through the normal OSP routing process.

Funding Opportunities

Howard Hughes Medical Institute Grants for Research Universities

The Howard Hughes Medical Institute's Undergraduate Science Education Program seeks to fund projects in two areas: Core Grants and Experiment Grants.

Core Grants support projects that strengthen undergraduate science education, including projects aimed at increasing involvement of traditionally underrepresented groups. These grants will be directed to projects in four key areas: student research, faculty development, curriculum development, and outreach & transitions.

The Experiment Grants program encourages applicants to adopt nontraditional approaches to addressing challenges in undergraduate science education. Because many of these proposals will have uncertain outcomes, they will be evaluated separately from Core Grant applications.

Institutions are limited in the number of applications they may submit, so OVPR review is required prior to submision to HHMI.

Changes to NEH application guidelines

The National Endowment for the Humanities has issued updated guidelines relating to their Collaborative Research and Scholarly Editions & Translations programs.

Translation projects, which were formerly categorized as Collaborative Research, now fall under the Scholarly Editions & Translation category, because of the similar criteria used to evaluate projects in the original language and projects which are translations.

Both new and veteran investigators are responsible for adhering to the new requirements for projects submitted for the October 29, 2009 due date, so the NEH encourages all potential applicants to read the new guidelines in their entirety to ensure compliance.
