Fall 2009

The class of 3,098 first-time freshmen includes students who entered the University during Summer 2009 and Fall 2009. Fifty-nine percent of the class are females, and 35 percent are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation comprise 36 percent of the group, while 16 percent are Catholic and 13 percent are Non-Denominational.

Ninety-seven percent of these students are United States citizens, while 94 (3.0%) are resident or nonresident aliens representing 30 foreign countries. By domicile, as reflected in the students' home addresses, the class of first-time freshmen is comprised of students from 43 states and the District of Columbia. Eighty percent of the first-time freshmen are from Texas.

Among students with high school class ranking, 73 percent were in the top quartile of their high school graduating classes. The score range for the middle fifty percent of the entering first-year class is 1090 – 1280 with a mean score of 1190 for the SAT and 23 – 29 with a mean score of 25.9 for the ACT examination.

Fall 2008

The class of 3,062 first-time freshmen includes students who entered the University during Summer 2008 and Fall 2008. Fifty-nine percent of the class are females, and 31 percent are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation comprise 36 percent of the group, while 16 percent are Non-Denominational and 14 percent are Catholic.

Ninety-seven percent of these students are United States citizens, while 94 (3.1%) are resident or nonresident aliens representing 29 foreign countries. By domicile, as reflected in the students' home addresses, the class of first-time freshmen is comprised of students from 41 states. Eighty-one percent of the first-time freshmen are from Texas.

Among students with high school class ranking, 72 percent were in the top quartile of their high school graduating classes. The score range for the middle fifty percent of the entering first-year class is 1110 – 1300 with a mean score of 1210 for the SAT and 23 – 28 with a mean score of 25.4 for the ACT examination.
