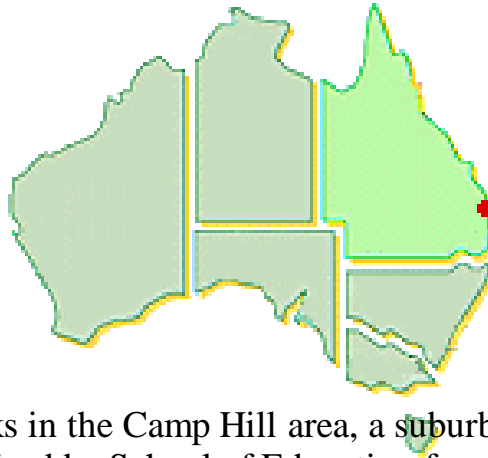


INTERNS IN AUSTRALIA SCHOOL OF EDUCATION

Candidates teach for three weeks in the Camp Hill area, a suburb of Brisbane, QLD, Australia, and are supervised by School of Education faculty. The EC-4 candidates teach in the Camp Hill Infant and Primary State School. Middle School and Secondary Candidates teach in the Whites Hill State College. The school experience begins after a weekend orientation.

Candidates live in an apartment while in Australia. A TransLink Bus Pass is provided for travel to and from school, and a food allowance is provided while in Brisbane.

This is a four week program. The faculty escorted roundtrip is scheduled to depart from DFW. At the end of the trip there is a visit to Auckland, New Zealand. A day trip to Rotorua and travel in the north island is included before returning to DFW. Accommodations are provided in Auckland.

Five days are designated for independent travel in Australia. Candidates may schedule trips in the country or remain in the Brisbane area. Popular places to visit include Sydney, Cairnes and the Great Barrier Reef, Melbourne, Uluru , the Gold Coast and the Sunshine Coast. Independent travel is not included in the cost of the trip.

Candidates must register for TED 4399 and meet all requirements for the intern year. Seminars meet weekly and a program highlighting the teaching experience is presented to faculty and candidates in the School of Education. Tuition is not included in the price of the trip.

BASIC COST: \$4,500. Application and Deposit of \$2,500 is due May 1 in Burleson 200 with the remainder due the first day of seminar. Cost includes room and a food allowance in Brisbane, the school experience, a TransLink Bus Pass for travel to and from school, a trip to Lone Pine, hotel accommodations in Auckland a day trip in New Zealand, the roundtrip flight and insurance.

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
