Baylor Joins the Texas Campus Compact

Baylor University is pleased to announce that Interim President David Garland has joined the Texas Campus Compact!

Founded in 2000, Texas Campus Compact (TXCC) is part of a national coalition that promotes service-learning and is committed to the civic purposes of higher education.

As a program of the Corporation for National and Community Service, TXCC advocates for responsible citizenship skills, develops collaborative campus-community partnerships, and supports faculty who integrate service-learning into their research and curricula.

In conjunction with our membership, Baylor will host an Ameri-Corps*VISTA member in the Division of Student Life.

In 1963, President John F. Kennedy created Volunteers in Service to America (VISTA), which expanded when President Bill Clinton created the AmeriCorps network in 1993.

Throughout the decades, VISTA has evolved to respond to local problems and the changing face of poverty. More than 170,000 VISTA members are responsible for building many innovative programs, including Head

Start, Job Corps, and Upward Bound.

Today, under President Barack Obama, VISTA is larger, stronger, and more vital than it has ever been.

Its 6,500 members—who serve at 1,200 projects nationwide—continue to address the root causes of poverty.

They are developing new programs, raising funds, helping manage projects, and otherwise building the capacity of nonprofit organizations to become sustainable and of families to break the cycle of poverty.

Summer of Service Fallon Rice-Uganda

Fallon Rice is a graduate student in the accounting program in the Hankamer School of Business. She spent two weeks this summer in Uganda with other students in the accounting department, an accounting professor, Ernst and Young representative, and members of Compassion International.

While there, they worked at Uganda Christian University (UCU) with their students in order to better their community, especially as it related to their churches and businesses. They consulted many small businesses

and helped to assess their needs for better accounting, internal controls, and overall business practices.

The group came up with solutions for each individual business. UCU students presented the ideas to the businesses and are following up with them for implementation. Additionally, the accounting students participated in an ethics case competition and held forums on topics such as the global recession.

According to Rice, the most important part of the trip was interacting

with the children and workers at the Compassion "Project Sites." At these sites so many children learn the Word of God, lead praise and worship, quote scripture memory verses, and are fed.

When asked for a personal statement about her trip, Fallon said the following: "Going to Uganda was a lifechanging experience for me. The highlight of my trip was when I decided to sponsor a child through Compassion International."

Engineers with a Mission Interview with Lisa Bradbury

Student organization Engineers with a Mission went to Honduras for two weeks this summer. They were working for a newly formed company called Village Energy, which provides appropriate technology and electricity to rural villages.

In one village, the

group made repairs to existing hydroelectric generator; in the second village they designed and installed power distribution grid which brings electricity to individual homes. They also talked with the people in the villages about the usefulness of electricity and provided them with

business training and ideas about how to use electricity in businesses. Engineers with a Mission does a few service projects here in Waco, including helping at the World Hunger Relief Farm.
