Position: Tenure-Track Assistant Professor of Community Health Education.

Qualifications: *Required:* Earned doctorate in health education, public health, or related field; ability to teach graduate and undergraduate courses in community health education; record of or potential for conducting research and mentoring students; philosophy compatible with the stated mission of the University to be a world-class institution dedicated to Christian principles and ideals. *Preferred:* Certified Health Education Specialist (or CHES-eligible); public health degree; experience in university teaching, research, community/public health.

Responsibilities: Teach graduate and undergraduate courses in community health education and help with student supervision. It is expected that the successful applicant will pursue an active research agenda in a related area of specialization, secure external funding, and provide service to the university and the profession.

Salary and Beginning Date: The salary will be commensurate with qualifications and professional experience. The anticipated date of appointment is August 2010.

Application: Review of completed applications will begin immediately and will continue until the position is filled. To ensure full consideration, applications should be completed by December 1, 2009.
