Responding to Hurricane Katrina

Report of a Community Meeting in Waco, Texas

In response to the terrible crisis of Hurricane Katrina and its aftermath, community leaders met at Baylor University in Waco, Texas, on September 2, 2005, in the Chapel of George W. Truett Seminary, to share information and coordinate our community's response. Spokespersons first shared information from the City of Waco, the Red Cross, the Salvation Army, the Waco Independent School District, and Seventh & James Baptist Church, which was the site of the first shelter for evacuees in our community. After a time of question and answer, the group of 150 leaders divided into four discussion groups to address ways of collaborating in our response. The groups included: (1) social services, (2) health care needs, (3) physical needs (food, clothing, shelter, long-term housing, and (4) information and volunteer coordination. Each group took notes of their discussion, which follow. These notes have not been edited and are provided here for reference to participants of the discussion.

SOCIAL SERVICES

Tim Brown—Methodist Home 753-0181 ask for Tim Brown

Openings for 30 children, aged 12-17
