

Ben attended the fifth annual meeting of the Association of Centers for the Study of Congress on May 17-18. This year the meeting was attended by over 50 congressional archivists and public policy center directors. It was hosted by the Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholars in the Ronald Reagan Building and International Trade Center in Washington. Sessions on Thursday morning included the use of congressional papers, current scholarship and future projections. In the afternoon the speakers addressed oral history and congressional research.



There was also an extended tour of the new underground Capitol Visitor's Center (*above photo*). Friday's sessions addressed "Where is the web taking us? OR where will we take the web?"; "Creating the digital records world"; 'Digital outreach by ACSC member organizations"; and 'Government Congress Centers in action.".
