Spring 2003 Plans

BOB BULLOCK EXHIBIT AREA

International Programs has moved upstairs, leaving the original exhibit area vacant. Dr. Schmeltekopf assigned this area to BCPM in the Spring of 2001. Jan Bullock is still planning on our setting up a Bob Bullock Exhibit Area in that space in time for the formal dedication of the Bullock Papers in the Summer of 2004. So we have already moved a couple of photographs to that area along with a sign announcing that it is the future home of the Bob Bullock Exhibit Area. We hope to work with Museum Studies to design the complete area with multi-media and interactive exhibits.

16MM FILM PROJECT

The Dowdy Foundation has awarded the BCPM a \$3,000 grant for the restoration and preservation of 16mm film and other media in the Dowdy Papers. Supplies have already been purchased and a 16mm projector has been donated by the Crouch Fine Arts Library. There are 75 films in the Dowdy Papers and another 75 reel-to-reel tapes that need to be transferred to digital format.

SCANNING PROJECT

With the arrival of the wide format scanner, work can begin on preservation of historic newspapers, campaign posters, and oversize scrapbooks. The Jack Hightower scrapbooks present the biggest challenge. These twelve oversize volumes document his ten years in the Texas Legislature including his work on the Constitutional Revision Committee. The scanner has been set up in the area formerly occupied by the International Programs. We will work with Tim Logan to find a student who can operate this equipment.
