ACCESSIONS

- JACK WHITE donated 24 notebooks of news clippings related to the JFK assassination and is allowing us to copy a number of related DVDs. Ben made three visits to Mr. White in June.
- JACK HIGHTOWER continues to add to his collection. In June he deposited three boxes of Abraham Lincoln items, three boxes of materials about the National Commission on Libraries and Information, and two boxes about the Masons.



- BOB PLATT deposited over a dozen boxes of books, magazines and campaign materials along with a number of campaign posters and 3-D items such as a revolutionary soldier lamp. Ben made two visits to Dr. Platt in June.
- MOODY LIBRARY sent over several newspapers related to JFK found in the bowels of the library.
- CHURCH AND STATE gifted us with a box of Moral Majority Reports from the early 1980s.

RESEARCHERS

- We furnished several photographic scans to the Texas General Land Office.
- We mailed hundreds of photocopies of materials from the Penn Jones papers to a researcher in CO along with over twenty photographic scans.
- Our tech guy spent considerable time making a copy of a Texas map for a film maker in New Mexico.

- One researcher requested info about a civil case in the Bob Thomas judicial papers.
- Avalon Publishers requested photographs of three men associated with the JFK investigation.
