Spring 2007	Student stole a test paper from room B207 at the Baylor Science Building knowing that student would, by such conduct, obtain an academic advantage.	Honor Council	Suspension for two semesters & student may not transfer any coursework back to Baylor during these semesters of suspension.

Fall 2007	Student used computer to take pictures of the exam that was returned that day in Psychology. Student showed other students the pictures of the exam.	Faculty	Student was asked to meet with Professor and Department Chair to discuss the seriousness of the violation and to submit two letters of apology.
