Financial Aid Reminders

The Financial Aid Step-by-Step, which follows this document, is the most comprehensive guide to financial aid at Baylor Law, and we encourage you to read that document very carefully. However, here are just a few reminders to get you started!

- **Cost of attendance for Summer 2021-Spring 2022 is published here (Cost of Attendance for Summer 2022-Spring 2023 will be available in early 2022):** <https://www.baylor.edu/law/index.php?id=931899>.
- Your cost of attendance will remain the same each quarter, even though you may not be taking the same number of hours. Here is your quarter hour breakdown:
 - Fall starters: 14 hours in the Fall, 15 hours in the Winter, 12 hours in the Spring
 - Spring starters: 14 hours in the Spring, 15 Hours in the Summer, 12 hours in the Fall
 - Summer starters: 13 hours in the Summer, 12 hours in the Fall, 14 hours in the Winter
- The Baylor University Student Financial Aid Office processes your financial aid and can see your account. The Law School cannot, although we are happy to answer many questions and can call the Student Financial Aid Office on your behalf. To contact the Student Financial Aid Office, call 254.710.2611.
- Carefully study the benefits and disadvantages of the different types of loans.
- The overall cost of attendance, along with tuition and fees, will change each Summer. Also, please note that if you take out federal loans, your cost of attendance will be changed slightly to accommodate origination fees.
- Communications from the Student Financial Aid Office will be via your Baylor email address.
- Outside scholarships must be reported to the Student Financial Aid Office. You can find that form here: www.baylor.edu/sfs/forms
- We encourage you to explore your BearWeb account.
- We encourage you to authorize Title IV funds in BearWeb. Doing this allows you to use federal loans to pay for miscellaneous charges (e.g., library fees, parking tickets).
