

## CBF Leadership Scholarship 2015-16 Application Instructions

The Cooperative Baptist Fellowship will award scholarships to Baptist students currently enrolled in one of the fifteen schools of the CBF Consortium of Theological Schools. The administration of the involved schools will recommend these scholars based on the application of the students and the belief that the students selected represent the best possible potential local ministry leaders for the mission and the ministry of CBF.

#### Students selected for the CBF Leadership Scholarship should ideally meet the following qualifications:

- Demonstrate a deep commitment and ongoing relationship with Christ,
- Clearly identify with CBF or espouse core values of CBF,
- Demonstrate actions and activities that complement the mission and purpose of CBF,
- Demonstrate a desire to pursue high quality scholarship,
- Show leadership potential within CBF missions and ministry, and
- Be actively pursuing training for ministry that complements the mission and purpose of CBF.

#### Students who receive the CBF Leadership Scholarship are expected to:

- Pursue a seminary degree full-time each semester while funded (funds are provided \$2000 for Fall semester and \$2000 for Spring semester and are not available for summer or interim period coursework);
- Attend General Assembly (or other nationally sponsored event if approved in advance i.e., ChurchWorks, Advocacy in Action, SelahVie) - \$1000 travel stipends are provided for travel only if student attends approved meeting;
- Represent CBF on campus and in local churches;
- Assist in planning and organization of CBF Day on campus with CBF staff members;
- Submit blogs highlighting your experiences in seminary or within the context of your ministry setting (suggested frequency: 1 per year); and
- Become involved in state and regional CBF organizations as appropriate.

### TRUETT SEMINARY - CBF LEADERSHIP SCHOLAR GUIDELINES

#### AWARD

CBF Scholarship awards \$4,000 per academic year (\$2,000 paid in each of the Fall and Spring semesters). These funds are additional to the Truett scholarship.

#### ELIGIBILITY

This scholarship is open to students enrolled in the M.Div. and M.A.C.M. programs with preference to M.Div. students.

Applicants must be current students

who have earned a minimum of 16 seminary hours at Truett

OR

who have earned a minimum of 9 hours at Truett AND transferred at least 9 hours from a college or seminary prior to attending Truett.

#### COURSELOAD REQUIREMENTS

Applicants must be fulltime students (minimum course load of 9 hours) for each of the fall and spring semesters in the year for which they are applying.

<u>SPECIAL EXCEPTIONS</u>: The exception to this is (1) a student who is fulltime for the fall semester and graduating in December OR (2) a student who is fulltime for the fall semester and part-time for the spring semester. Applicants, both new and renewing, who meet these two exceptions, are eligible to receive funding only for the fall semester. However, scholarship award nominations are at the discretion of the Truett scholarship committee. Final scholarship awards are at the discretion to CBF, as are decisions regarding invitation to CBF assembly.

#### **EVENT REQUIREMENTS**

Recipients must attend CBF General Assembly in June following the year of award or as required by CBF. Recipients are highly encouraged to attend optional events sponsored by CBF. It is the recipient's responsibility to access and submit an event evaluation for all events attended. The form is available on the Truett Scholarship website and should be submitted to Grear Howard at *Grear\_Howard@baylor.edu*. Event evaluation forms must be submitted within one month after attending the CBF event.

#### SCHOLARSHIP RENEWAL

Recipients of the CBF Leadership Scholarship desiring to continue this scholarship <u>must submit a Renewal Application in</u> <u>each subsequent year.</u>

Recipients with any lapse in program must submit a new application to be reconsidered for this award.

The CBF Scholarship is awarded on two-semester basis. Renewal is not guaranteed but you may apply to renew the scholarship for an additional 2 semesters if you meet all renewal application guidelines and maintain your leadership in ministry. The *maximum number* of semesters that a student may receive this scholarship is four semesters.
