

DAY 1, Sun, July 30

DEPART USA

Departure for our flight to London. Dinner and breakfast are served on board. (meals aloft)

DAY 2, Mon, July 31 **ARRIVE LONDON/OXFORD** After arriving at Heathrow London we will transfer by luxury coach through the beautiful English countryside to Oxford University, the oldest university in the English speaking world with classes dating to the 11th century. Oxford is a congregation of 40 independent colleges and private halls that make up the university. Our first stop will be Regent's Park College, the Baptist college formerly known as Stepney, founded in London in 1810 and part of Oxford since 1922. We will visit the famed Angus Library with its 500,000 items including autographs of C.H. Spurgeon, Alexander MacLaren and other Baptist leaders, along with the sign from William Carey's cobbler shop. We will go around the corner to the Eagle & Child to the room where the Inklings (Lewis, Tolkien, Charles Williams et al) met for decades on Tuesday to read their writings to one another. Then past the Martyr's Memorial we will walk down Broad Street, pass Blackwell's famed bookstore, by Christopher Wren's Sheldonian Theater, the Bodlean Library to the University Church of St. Mary's where Wesley, John Henry Newman and C.S. Lewis preached. Walking up High Street we will arrive at Magdalene College, see the rooms where C.S. Lewis lived and tutored, and walk along the beautiful Cherwell where Addison walked and where punters enjoy the waters. Then we board our coach to The Kilns, the home of C.S. Lewis and later Joy Davidman. Sit at his desk, see the original Wardrobe of Narnia, stand in the tiny room where he slept and the room where he passed on to immortality. We will then visit his gravesite and Holy Trinity Church, the tiny church where you can sit in his pew. We will return to the Oxford Hotel with a treasury of memories for a lifetime. (B aloft)

DAY 3, Tue, Aug 1

CAMBRIDGE

We depart Oxford this morning for Cambridge, site of one of Europe's oldest and best-known universities. Chartered early in the thirteenth century, Cambridge University, and much of the town's medieval architecture still remains: winding streets, spired churches and turreted buildings. Upon arrival we visit St. Andrews Street Baptist Church where Spurgeon once taught Sunday school. We have time for lunch here, and then we visit Holy Trinity Church, where Charles Simeon, often hailed as an ancestor of the evangelical movement in the Church of England, once served. Then we visit Trinity College, sister college to Oxford's Christ Church and alma mater to six British prime ministers. We attend Evensong at King's College Chapel and then proceed to the Holiday Inn Express for check-in, with dinner on your own. (B)

DAY 4, Wed, Aug 2

Today we trace the early life and ministry of Charles Spurgeon, beginning at his birthplace in Kelvedon. We visit Stambourne Congregational Church, where his father was pastor, and Artillery Street Evangelical Church, where his conversion took place in January 1850. From there we proceed to Isleham Ferry, the site of Spurgeon's baptism in May of that same year. We make a brief stop in Teversham, where he preached his first sermon to a group of locals in a cottage on High Street. Then we continue to Waterbeach Baptist Church, where Spurgeon took his first pastorate as a young man. Following our visit there, we return to our hotel in Cambridge for overnight, with dinner on your own. (B)

DAY 5, Thu, Aug 3

We depart Cambridge this morning and drive to London, where we see Metropolitan Tabernacle (originally called New Park Street Chapel), the church Spurgeon began serving at age 20 and where he pastored for 38 years. During his time there, he founded Spurgeon's College, which was named after him posthumously. We visit the college, taking time for lunch here (on your own). Then we meet with the Rev. Dr. Peter Morden, Vice Principal and Tutor of Church History & Spirituality. Dr. Morden is an expert on Bunyan and Spurgeon and has written biographies on both. After our time here, we continue to West Norwood Cemetery to visit Spurgeon's gravesite. From there we proceed to Queen's Gate Hotel for check-in, with dinner on your own. (B)

DAY 6, Fri, Aug 4

We begin today with a visit to Wesley's Chapel, known as the "Cathedral of World Methodism" and one of London's undiscovered jewels. Next to the chapel is John Wesley's House, where he lived the last 12 years of his life. Then just opposite the Chapel, we visit Bunhill Fields, the "outcast's" cemetery, reserved for those who refused to compromise their convictions and step in line with the established Church of England. Consequently, it has become a cemetery filled with some of the most famous names in Christendom, many whose preaching, writing and living have influenced many generations since for good. Among notables buried here: Isaac Watts, Susanna Wesley, John Bunyan, William Blake, Daniel DeFoe and John Rippon. Bunhill Fields was also the main burial ground for Quakers in the London area until 1857. Next we visit Westminster Chapel, founded in 1841 under the leadership of Rev. Samuel Martin and a beacon of hope in what was then one of London's poorest slums. From there we go to All Souls Langham Place, whose most well-known former cleric was John Stott, who served as rector from 1950 until 1975 and who then held the title "Rector Emeritus" until his death in 2011. City Temple, where Joseph Parker pastored for 33 years, from 1869 until his death in 1902. We conclude our day at Westminster Central Hall, erected to mark the centenary of John Wesley's death. From there we return to our hotel for overnight, with dinner on your own. (B)

DAY 7, Sat, Aug 5

LONDON

Enjoy the full day at leisure in London today, using your Travel Card to get around the city on public transportation. Down through the years, from a small Roman settlement housed within stout fortifications, London has steadily grown to become one of the world's greatest capital cities. Look for iconic sites such as Marble Arch, Mayfair, Piccadilly, the Houses of Parliament and Big Ben, Buckingham Palace and Hyde Park. You may choose to visit St. Paul's Cathedral, which has been the site of many famous state occasions, including the funeral of Winston Churchill in 1965 and the wedding of the Prince and Princess of Wales in 1981. Or perhaps take a ride on the London Eye for panoramic views of the city. Dinner is on your own this evening, with overnight at our hotel. (B)

DAY 8, Sun, Aug 6

Today attend worship services at Kensington Temple and All Souls Langham Place. Then enjoy the remainder of the day on your own to further explore London, again with Travel Cards provided for use on public transportation. Dinner is on your own with overnight at our hotel. (B)

DAY 9, Mon, Aug 7

This morning after breakfast we transfer to the airport for our return flight to the USA, arriving back to Dallas this afternoon. (B, meals aloft)

All sites listed in the itinerary will be seen but the sequence and days may be altered to adjust to religious holidays, special closings of sites, air schedule changes, hotel confirmation, etc.

TOUR CONDITIONS

PRICE OF BASIC 9-DAY TOUR: \$3,799 per person from Dallas (double occupancy)

NOT INCLUDED IN BASIC TOUR PRICE: Supplement in air fare for departure from cities other than Dallas; meals not listed as being included; single room supplement; excess baggage and forwarding of baggage; passports; personal items such as laundry or tips for personal favors; Travel Protection Plan; any costs resulting from absence or deviation from the itinerary and any items not shown herein as being included.

DEVIATION ITINERARY: Any adjustment in standardized air or land itinerary will carry a \$100 fee (for each change) in addition to any additional expense required. This fee

is applicable for research projected and/or accepted. In an effort to ensure efficient handling of these requests, **Dehoney Travel, Inc. requires that a tour deposit be received before a deviation request can be processed.** If deviating from the group tour program, there will be no refund for any service not used.

AIR TRANSPORTATION: Economy class, applicable on American Airlines or any IATA carrier. U.S. departure, security, customs and inspection taxes, foreign departure tax, and fuel surcharges are included in the tour rate and are subject to any change that may be imposed prior to departure. Supplement may apply for departure from any city other than Dallas. Please note that specific air seat requests will be forwarded to the airline on your behalf but are subject to final approval/confirmation by the airline.

TOUR DOCUMENTS: The name on your air ticket **must exactly match** your name as it appears on your passport. You must forward a copy of the photo/informational page of your passport within two weeks of enrollment on the tour. If applying for a new or renewed passport, send the copy as soon as you receive your new passport.

HOTELS: Three-star/superior-tourist-class. Porterage of one bag per person included at hotels where available. **While Dehoney Travel will try to match roommates, we cannot guarantee a roommate will be available.** In this case, the payment of single supplement will be required. When available, single rooms are often smaller than double rooms. **Single supplement, \$750.**

MEALS & SIGHTSEEING: Breakfast included daily. Lunches and dinners at own expense. English-speaking, government-licensed local guides and transfer assistance where required. Gratuities to your guides, drivers, etc. and donations at touring sites in the amount of \$100 are included in the tour rate.

BAGGAGE ALLOWANCE: Due to space limitations on buses used, we have included porterage for only one check-on bag (combination width, length and height not to exceed 62 inches and maximum weight of 50 pounds) in tour cost. You may also take one carry-on that will fit under your airline seat or in the overhead compartment.

PAYMENT: A deposit of \$500 per person is required at least 100 days prior to departure in order to confirm tour membership. Within 100 days of departure, space may be limited and/or a supplement in airfare may apply. Preferred method of payment is by cash, check, or bank transfer. For any deposits or payments made by credit card, there will be a 3% surcharge to



cover merchant processing fees. Balance of tour price is due upon receipt of final invoice, approximately 10 weeks prior to departure. Enrollment in and payment of deposit constitutes your acceptance of the Tour Conditions described herein.

DELAYS, CANCELLATION AND REFUND: Dehoney Travel is not responsible for changes and delays in airline schedules and cannot reimburse passengers for expenses resulting from delays, re-issuance of air tickets, etc. In event of cancellation, there will be a fee of \$100 for Dehoney Travel, Inc. to cover administrative costs. In addition, the following scale of charges (per person) will apply when notice of cancellation is given in writing after the booking is confirmed:

- Up to 121 days prior to departure, \$100.
- 120-61 days prior to departure, \$500.
- 60-46 days, 25% of total tour price.
- 45-31 days, 50% of total tour price.
- 30-0 days, 100% cancellation penalty.

All cancellation notifications must be made in writing to Dehoney Travel, Inc. Please allow four weeks for cancellation refund processing.

After ticketing of international air, a cancellation penalty of 100% of the airfare is in effect. On or after the date of departure there can be no refund for any service not used.

TRAVEL PROTECTION PLAN: As many U.S. health carriers do not provide benefits while outside the country and cancellation penalties can be substantial for many tours, Dehoney Travel, Inc. offers a Travel Protection Plan, TripCare Classic, through Allianz Global Assistance. The Option to Waive Pre-existing Condition requires purchase of Travel Protection within 14 days of the date on your deposit check or your credit card deposit being processed at Dehoney Travel. You may decline the Travel Protection Plan, but a signed disclaimer is required and all charges for cancellation or medical treatment/transport while traveling are your responsibility.
