Notes about major requirements:

- In addition to admission to the University, prospective students must be admitted to the Department of Theater Arts by a formal audition/interview conducted by the Theater Arts faculty.
- Students must be accepted into the B.F.A. Design program by formal interview. Students are eligible to apply during their second semester.
- Student must actively participate in all departmental play productions.
- Refer to the Departmental Student Handbook for other extra-and co-curricular requirements.
- THEA Advanced Performance Electives: THEA 3103, 3303, 3304, 4103, 4297, 4298, 4301, 4335, 4365, 4366, 4VC5, or 4V99.
- English requirement: Students are allowed to take either ENG 1304 or FAS 1118, 1128, and 1138. Students majoring in the sciences may take ENG 3300 instead of ENG 1304.
- Students must earn a grade of 'C' or better in the Theater Arts courses used for the major.
- Check your degree audit often through Bearweb to ensure that you are making timely progress toward your degree.

- Course selection is subject to availability within each semester.
- Please keep in mind that this is only a suggested sequence. Actual sequence will vary according to possible second major, minor, other program of study (including pre-health) and individual circumstances (ex., transfer credit, dual credit, and credit by exam).
- In order to complete your degree, you must fulfill all requirements in your major and general requirements for the Bachelor of Fine Arts.
- To complete a double major, you may not count any courses toward both majors.
