*All students must graduate with a minimum of 124 hours,  
36 of which must be at the 3000/4000 level.*

#### Notes about major requirements:

– The student who pursues the anthropology major will be prepared to enter graduate study with sufficient training in basic areas of anthropology. It is suggested that the student take additional courses in related social, biological, and behavioral sciences.

– ANT Subfields: The student must complete a minimum of three upper level (3000-4000) semester hrs in ANT from each of the following subfields: Cultural Anthropology, Archaeology, and Biological Anthropology. See your degree audit for course offerings in each subfield.

– ANT Electives: The student must complete at least twelve semester hours of ANT electives, at least nine of which must be at the 3000-4000 level. ANT 1305 is recommended here as well. \*Note: ANT 4670, 4680, or 4690 (field school) may count as 6 hours of advanced ANT electives.

Environmental ANT Electives: The student must complete six hours of advanced environmental anthropology courses from the following options: ANT 4311, 4312, 4340, 4351, 4362, 4680.
