- If you start in a higher-level Greek course, you still need to complete **27 hours of Greek courses**.
- Because most of our majors go on to graduate school, we have recommended certain courses that will prepare students for this likely eventuality. Some of these courses are only offered during one semester: CLA 3301-Roman Civilization (spring); CLA 3302-Greek Civilization (fall); HIS 4322-Ancient Greece (fall); HIS 4324-Ancient Rome (spring).
