Professional Electives: Complete 1 option: 1) Complete minor in an area such as Communication Sciences, Educational Psychology, International Studies, Leadership Studies, Medical Humanities, Nonprofit Studies, Poverty Studies, Religion, Women's and Gender Studies.

2) Select 15 hrs from the following courses: CLA 3381, CSS 4311, CSS 4313, PUBH 4321, PUBH 4327, REL 3382, REL 3390, SOC 3311; SOC 3355, SOC 4310, SOC 4353, SWO 4316, TED 3380. 3) Family Life Education Courses: CFS 4356, 4367; PUBH 4321, SWO 4322.
