New Badges for ITS and E-Library Coming Soon

It is critical that care is taken to validate the identity of university staff members who work on Baylor computers. (See the June 2009 BearAware Bulletin) This identification is primarily accomplished by inspection of a picture badge carried by all ITS and Electronic Library staff and student workers. Beginning in late January, these badges will change to improve security. The new badges will include a hologram and other design features that make them unique and more difficult to duplicate. The current badge design, shown at right, should no longer be accepted once the new badges are rolled out.

Safely Store Data for Remote Access

Do you know about BearSpace? BearSpace (http://bearspace.baylor.edu/) is a file storage system for students, faculty, and staff that provides 1Gb of disk space per person. Files like spreadsheets, reports, homework assignments, and graphics can be stored in BearSpace and are accessible from anywhere on the Internet. The system also allows for secure file sharing with others, even people outside of Baylor.
